PRESIDENT'S AND CEO'S REPORT

We are pleased to submit to members this report on Swimming Queensland's activities during the 2014/15 financial year.

2014 Commonwealth Games

Queensland swimmers contributed strongly to Australia's success at the 2014 Glasgow Commonwealth Games. Our gold medallists in individual events were Thomas Fraser-Holmes, Mitch Larkin, Cate Campbell, Taylor McKeown, Leiston Pickett, Emily Seebohm, Rowan Crothers, and Daniel Fox. Both Cate and Emily set new Commonwealth Games records, while Rowan established a new world standard. Cate, her sister, Bronte, and Melanie Schlanger were members of the Australian team that broke the world record in the Women's 4 x 100m Freestyle Relay. Six members of the coaching team were Queenslanders.

2014 Pan Pacific Championships

Thomas Fraser-Holmes, Cate Campbell, and Emily Seebohm enjoyed further success at the 2014 Pan Pacific Championships at the Gold Coast. They were joined by Cameron McEvoy and Alicia Coutts in winning gold medals in individual events. New Commonwealth records were set by Cameron, Cate and Emily. Queensland was once again strongly represented in the relays, and all members of the successful Women's 4 x 100m Freestyle and 4 x 100m Medley relays were Queensland swimmers. Seven members of the coaching team were Queenslanders.

2014 Para Pan Pacific Championships

A total of 20 individual gold medals were won by Queensland swimmers at the 2014 Para Pan Pacs in Pasadena, California. They were claimed by Michael Anderson, Blake Cochrane (3), Rowan Crothers (2), Daniel Fox (3), Brenden Hall (3), Grant Patterson (4), and Kayla Clarke (4).

2015 Australian Open Championships

Queensland swimmers put on another dominant display at the 2015 Australian Open Championships, culminating in the State retaining the men's and women's team shields. The most outstanding Queensland swimmer at the Championships was Emily Seebohm, who won four individual gold medals and set a new Commonwealth record in the process.

Three-quarters of the Australian team selected from the Championships for the 2015 Kazan World Championships swim for Queensland. They will be joined by seven Queensland coaches. Queensland will be represented at the Glasgow IPC World Championships by eight swimmers and two coaches.

2015 Australian Multi Class Championships

Liam Schluter was Queensland's outstanding competitor at the 2015 Australian Multi Class Championships, with five gold medals.

2015 Australian Age Championships

Queensland's emerging swimmers emulated the feat of their older counterparts a couple of weeks earlier by winning the W.B. Phillips trophy as the premier State at the 2015 Australian Age Championships. Of the 67 gold medals won by Queensland swimmers, Elijah Winnington claimed six, while Gemma Cooney and Shayna Jack claimed four each. The number of Queenslanders making a final at the Age Championships rose to 220, the highest on record, while the number of Queensland coaches with gold medallists at the Championships matched last year's new benchmark of 23.

St Peter's Western was the champion club.

2015 Australian Open Water Championships

At the 2015 Australian Open Water Championships, 17 swimmers won gold medals. Queensland swimmers claimed 35 medals in total.

2014 Australian Short Course Championships

Queensland's top performers at the 2014 Australian Short Course Championships were Emma McKeon, with five gold medals, and Emily Seebohm and Grant Patterson, who each won four events.

2014 Queensland Championships

The 2014 Queensland Championships were well supported, with 1,700 competitors in individual events, and 2,400 competitors in relays.

Major award winners at the 2014 Queensland Championships were Minna Atherton (McDonald's Swimmer of the Meet), Kolby Gubecka (McDonald's Age Group Swimmer of the Meet), Lacie Heery (Country Swimmer of the Meet), and Daniel Fox and Rowan Crothers (joint winners of McDonald's Disability Swimmer of the Meet). TSS Aquatics repeated its success at the 2013 Championships by taking home the President's Trophy for champion club.

Athlete and Coach Development

The death of our Head Coach, Paulus Wildeboer, in May last year impacted heavily on the impetus we were building around athlete and coach development. As all who knew Paulus found, he was a splendid leader, with high energy and strong vision.

Our search for a person to take the reins from Paulus led to the appointment late last year of Stephan Widmer OAM. Stephan brought with him an impressive coaching record, including Olympic Games success with Libby Trickett (nee Lenton). Like Paulus, he has immense passion for the sport of swimming, a thirst for knowledge, and a strong vision for the sport's future.

The main development activity undertaken during the year consisted of five testing camps at the Brisbane Aquatic Centre, initiated by Paulus. They were attended by a total of 74 swimmers and 40 coaches. The practice of sending a team to the NSW Open Water Swimming Championships was continued; a workshop for Swimmers with a Disability attracted 20 swimmers and eight coaches; regional clinics were attended by 163 swimmers and 75 coaches; and 50 swimmers participated in the Athlete Potential Workshop.

Technical Official Development

A new workshop to mentor Technical Officials was successfully introduced to 48 officials from around the State. This activity was complemented by a forum for Referees, with 48 in attendance, and another for Starters, which catered for 17 officials. Mentoring was also provided at the Queensland Championships and at the State Teams Championships in Canberra.

The considerable effort put into developing our Technical Officials over the past decade is showing extremely positive results, evidenced by the fact that there are now seven Queensland officials on the FINA List: Matt Bromley (FNQ), Erin Collis (NQ), Teresa Goddard (Bne), Maree Oberg(GC), Gary Shepherdson (Bne), David Towner (WB), and David Gregory (Bne).

Membership Development

A state-wide pilot of the new Junior Dolphin Program commenced on 1 July last year with funding from the SAL Foundation. Conceived in Queensland, the concept is aimed at increasing membership, strengthening swimming's revenue base, forging strong relationships with swim schools, fostering long-term success in competition, and creating a swimming product that appeals to young swimmers.

Early results have been very encouraging, with the number of SQ members aged seven years and under more than doubling to a new high of over 3,500 children. The pilot is also being conducted in Victoria, Tasmania and Western Australia.

Other important Queensland initiatives that have also attracted SAL Foundation funding support are the Growing Up In Lycra and Making Champion Men programs, which were created by SQ to help young swimmers to make the most of their time in swimming and to go on to enjoy fulfilling lives. The national program will be delivered under the banner of Beyond The Black Line.

SQ's work with indigenous and culturally and linguistically diverse communities and children with special needs continues to expand. In 2014/15, SQ, through Wendy Ross, its Inclusion Manager, delivered clinics and programs to 4,000 participants from these groups. We also delivered services to the Doomadgee community for the Queensland Government, and visited several other indigenous communities in the Gulf region. Under our partnership with our major sponsor, McDonald's, Macca's Mini Meets were held in 73 swim schools for nearly 15,000 children.

Awards

New inductees into the SQ Hall of Fame were Jess Schipper, Stephanie Rice OAM and Shannon Rollason.

SQ Life Membership was conferred on Gloria Williams (Bne), Jill Ryan (Bne), Karen Macleod (GC), and Gary Shepherdson (Bne). SQ Awards of Excellence were presented to Erin Collis (NQ), Bethea Pattel (NQ), Jenny Veivers (DD), Gerry Epstein (GC), Steve Carsley (Bne) and Judy Hooton (Bne).

Erin Collis (NQ) and Gary Shepherdson (Bne) were the joint recipients of the John Keppie Award for officiating excellence. The Susie O'Neill Award was presented once again to Cate Campbell.

General

At the beginning of the year, SQ secured the lease of the swim shop at the Brisbane Aquatic Centre, which it now operates under an exclusive arrangement with Speedo. The first year of trading exceeded our expectations, and we are now looking forward to growing the business into a significant revenue source for our sport.

Acknowledgments

The thousands of volunteers across all levels of swimming are the lifeblood of our sport. We once again offer our heartfelt thanks to each and every one of them for their selfless contribution. Of vital importance also is the support of the Queensland Government and our sponsors – McDonald's, Georgina Hope Foundation, Speedo, and Medal Shots – whose financial backing is invested in the development of our swimmers, coaches and Technical Officials.

We also acknowledge John Keppie OAM for the sterling service he has given to swimming over the past four decades. John retired as SQ President on 31 December last year after 26 continuous years as a Board member. We also pay tribute to Dr Simon Hooton, who has decided not to stand for re-election. In total, Simon has served on the SQ Board for eight years. Simon has been a member of various SQ Sub-Committees throughout, and has taken particular pride in the programs implemented by the Technical Sub-Committee that have contributed to the development of world class Technical Officials.

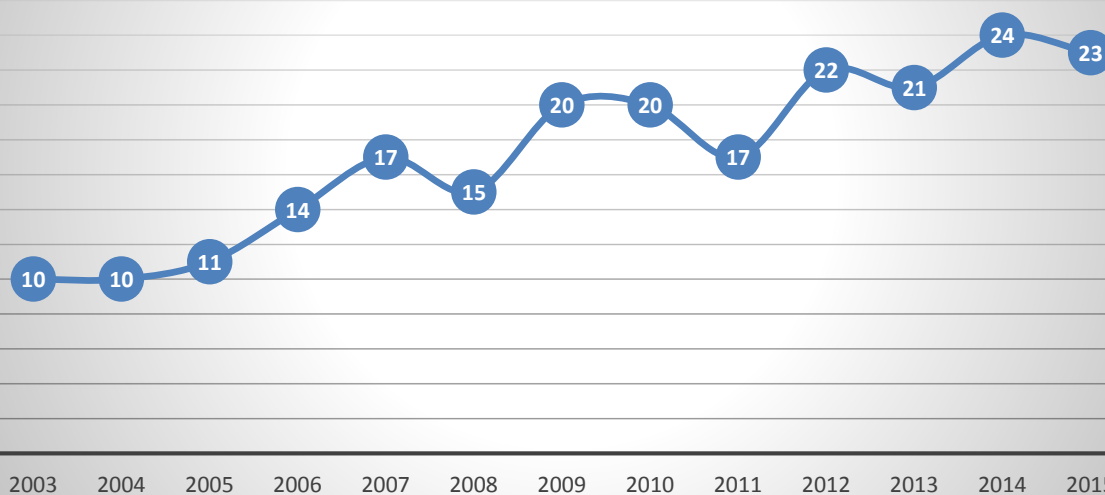

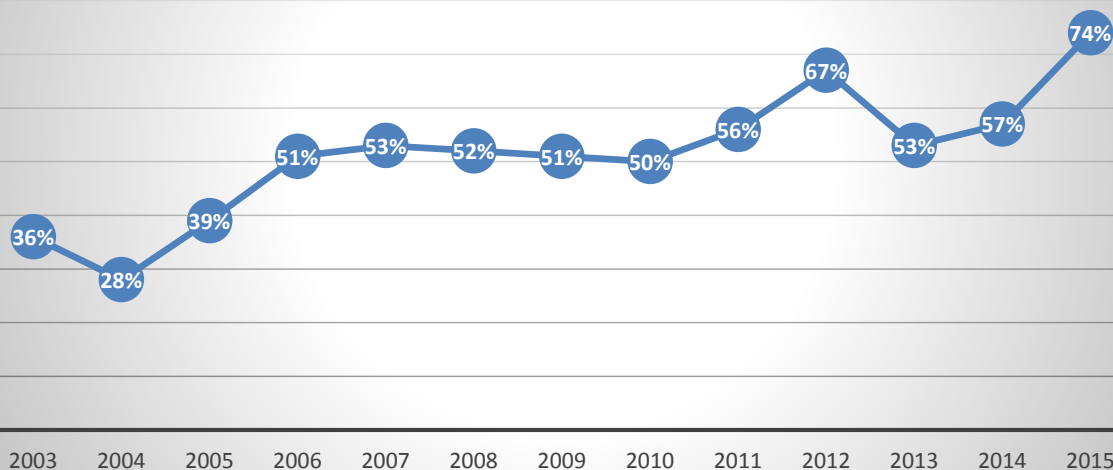

TREASURER'S REPORT

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I submit the Treasurer's Annual Report, together with the audited Annual Financial Report, for the year ended 30 April 2015.

The Association recorded an operating surplus of \$183,640, with Total Revenue growing to \$2.78m. Total Accumulated Funds now stand at \$1.05m.

The increase in Grants relates principally to funding received from the Queensland Government to deliver swimming-based programs in the Doomadgee community. Swim Meet income also grew following an increase in nomination fees for SQ meets. SQ's net profit from swim meets was \$210,000. Expenditure remained consistent with that incurred in 2013/14.

At the beginning of the financial year, SQ obtained the lease on the swim shop at the Brisbane Aquatic Centre. The first year of trading was very satisfactory, with sales exceeding \$300,000. The introduction of an on-line purchasing facility in 2015/16 is expected to help grow the business and produce more funding for the development of the sport.

SQ's healthy balance sheet will enable the organisation to begin acquiring the resources needed to work more closely with clubs and coaches in growing membership, which has been in decline now for some time. A key strategy for doing so is the Junior Dolphin Program, a feature of which is free membership for children aged seven years and under.

I take this opportunity to thank the other members of the Finance Sub-Committee – Michael Cox, Greg Kukla and Peter Turnbull – for their assistance.

Notes to and forming part of the Financial Statements

for the year ended 30th April 2015

Note 1 - Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are a general purpose financial report and have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the AASB and the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act. The financial statements have also been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non current assets (where applicable) and financial assets and liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

The financial report covers Queensland Swimming Association Inc. which is incorporated under the Associations Incorporations Act 1981 and is domiciled in Brisbane Queensland.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Income Tax

No provision has been made for income tax as the Association is exempt under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and current replacement cost. Costs are assigned on a first-in first out basis.

Property, Plant & Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amount.

Depreciation

The depreciable amounts of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, are depreciated over their useful lives to the entity commencing from the time that the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements. Depreciation rates are plant & equipment 7.5% to 75%, leasehold improvements 10% and Historical Gallery 10%.

Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not legal ownership, are transferred to the Association are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised, recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual value. Leased assets are amortised over their estimated useful lives. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense of the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Financial Instruments

Financial instruments are initially measured at cost on trade date, which includes transaction costs, when the related contractual obligation or right exists. Subsequent to initial recognition these instruments are measured dependent on whether they are classified as Financial Assets at fair value through profit and loss, loans and receivables, held to maturity investments, available for sale financial assets or financial liabilities.

Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the liability for employees arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the Association to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Government Grants

Government grants are recognised at fair value when the entity obtains control of the grant, it is probable that the economic benefits will flow and the grant can be measured reliably.

Revenues

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon delivery of the goods to customers. Revenue from rendering a service is recognised upon delivery of the service. Interest income is recognised on an accruals basis.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Impairment of Assets

At each reporting date, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indicator exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the assets fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the assets carrying value. Any excess of the assets carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee members evaluate estimates and judgments incorporated into the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Association.

Note 12 - Financial Instruments

Financial risk management



REGIONAL REPORTS

BRISBANE SWIMMING ASSOCIATION INC

President: Suellen Hardie

I am pleased to present the 2014/15 Annual Report. This has been another successful season for the region, its swimmers, coaches, officials and clubs.

The region's membership currently stands at 86 clubs with 10,651 members, of whom 5,649 are competitive members. Participation has continued to grow at all levels of meets conducted within the region. The regional championships (Short Course, Junior and Senior Metropolitans, Sprints and Open Water) attracted more than 16,200 nominations. The 24 A-Grade meets, conducted by 18 clubs over 8 weekends, saw over 32,000 nominations, while the 12 Development meets, conducted by 12 clubs over 12 weekends, saw over 9,500 nominations.

A significant purpose of regional competition is to encourage the progression from club, through interclub to state and national level, while also preparing swimmers for those higher levels of competition. Brisbane's regional structure allows swimmers the opportunity to progress gradually from each level to the next. Development meets offer an introduction to competition beyond club level. A-Grade meets provide more stringent competition practice and the opportunity to achieve qualifying times for regional and state championships. It is pleasing to see more and more swimmers moving through these levels.

Brisbane swimmers successfully represented the region at the annual Patron's Shield meet, this season held on the Gold Coast. Once again, Brisbane retained the Shield. At Swimming Qld State Championships, Brisbane continued to field 2 teams in the Regional Relays. Swimmers from Brisbane clubs featured prominently in the Queensland team that won the State Teams Age Short Course Championships at the Australian Institute of Sport, Canberra.

Internationally, the 2014/15 season contained the Glasgow Commonwealth Games, the Pan Pacific Championships on the Gold Coast, the Para-Pan Pacific Championships in Pasadena and the BHP Billiton Aquatic Super Series in Perth. Brisbane swimmers brought home many of the medals from these meets and Brisbane coaches were there with them.

On the development front, the now annual Big Brisbane Camp, at Runaway Bay, inspired 26 swimmers to bigger and better performances. Brenton Rickard and Jade Neilson were the guest speakers, with Dean Boxall as head coach. Open Water swimmers were provided with 2 assemblies and a development competition to hone their skills. These were under the guidance of Trent Grimsey, World-Record holding Open Water swimmer. Macca's Clinics were conducted for 7 to 12 year-olds at Lawnton SC and Western Aquatics SC. The young swimmers were treated to talks by high-profile swimmers Kylie Palmer and Leah Neale. Brisbane Region has 1555 swimmers recognised in JX and 451 in YPS.

In the 2014/15 season, Swimming Qld introduced the new Junior Dolphin Membership Program for swimmers 7 and under. There are now 1113 Junior Dolphin members in Brisbane, enjoying free membership and an introduction to the sport of swimming. Genesis Aquatics hosted the first ever Junior Dolphin Carnival - a great success for the over 100 young participants. Huge thanks to coach Brendan Keogh for his enthusiasm in organising and conducting this event.

Brisbane is well represented by Technical Officials at state and national competitions. We offer our congratulations to Teresa Goddard, who has been appointed to the FINA referees' list for the period 2015-2018. She will be officiating at the 2015 FINA World Championships in Kazan, Russia, later this year. Here is a good place to mention that we are always looking for new people to swell the technical official ranks at our Brisbane Swimming meets. Helping out at club night, then Development and A-Grade meets is the way to begin - assistance and a warm welcome is readily offered to all volunteers.

The 2013/14 annual Awards Presentation function recognised last season's top performers. Susan Weldon was named Technical Official of the Year. Edlene Koplick received the Hazel Ferguson Award for Volunteer of the Year. Rowan Crothers received the Glen Bigg President's Trophy as Swimmer of the Year and Shayna Jack was awarded the Brisbane Rising Star Award. Brisbane Swimming acknowledges the ongoing support of our sponsor Vorgee, whose representatives Leigh Dempsey and Quinton McCoy are regularly in attendance at our meets, as well as at our awards function. The continuing sponsorship from McDonald's is also much appreciated and provides significant financial support to the association.

In December 2014, John Keppie OAM, Life Member of Brisbane Swimming, retired from his positions as President of Swimming Qld and SQ Technical Manager. John, by his commitment and enthusiasm for swimming and officiating over more than 30 years, has been an inspiration and mentor to many, many others. Brisbane Swimming would like to pay tribute to John's dedicated service to our sport.

Many thanks to all the technical officials, volunteers, club administrators, coaches, parents and of course the swimmers who, in combination, contribute so much to the success of Brisbane Swimming. We are also indebted to Swimming Queensland for its role in our administration. Particular thanks to my fellow members of the current Management Committee for the time and effort they put into the running of this association. Thank you all.

Membership

During the season our Region had some 1982 registered swimmers (competitors and recreational which pleasingly represents an increase of 407 swimmers on the previous year), some 25 registered clubs, 47 coaches (38 last year), 26 officials, 789 parents (541 last year), 23 non-swimmers and 16 life members.

Again a special mention must be made about the recipient of our Rising Star Award in the 2014 year, Elijah Winnington (PBC). Under the guidance of coach Richard Scarce, Elijah has continued to excel in the pool this season. Elijah won 5 gold medals at Qld State Championships and then went on to win 6 gold medals (one up on the previous year) and 1 silver medal, breaking 3 state records at National Age Championships. Congratulations once again to Elijah and his coach Richard Scarce.

Club Performances

Our Gold Coast clubs again showed their strength throughout the season:

- In the Go Club Awards for the 2014 season, Helensvale and Gullivers were awarded Gold, Miami was awarded silver and Somerset and Southport were awarded bronze.
- Our Regional Championships were won by TSS on 2175 points followed by Helensvale on 1832 points and Miami third on 1379 points.
- Club performances at Nationals Open TSS 10th place, Miami 11th place, Southport 14th place and at National Age TSS 2nd place, Miami 7th place and Southport 10th place.

Regional Championships

Our Gold Coast Winter Short Course Championships held over two days in August 2014 were hosted by Emmanuel Swim Club with 423 competitors taking part on day one and 453 competitors on day two.

Our Gold Coast Championships held in March 2015 were hosted by the Miami Swim Club and attracted some 451 swimmers, a decrease on the numbers from the previous year (531).

Helensvale Swim Club took out the points award at our Regional Championships on the day but were beaten overall by TSS taking into consideration the points earned for our separate Relay Day. Congratulations to both TSS and Helensvale.

Thank you also to Emmanuel and Miami Swim Clubs for hosting those meets.

Meets

During the season 21 meets were held (an increase from 17 meets held the previous year) which meets included A and B grade meets, Restricted meets and Regional Championships.

Thank you to our various clubs, and parents who assisted in the running of these meets and in particular a thanks to our tireless technical officials who turned up to each and every meet. (in addition to State, National and School meets).

Officials

We continue to have a very large group of accredited and active technical officials here on the Gold Coast.

Throughout the season we had 24 officials who attended 3 or more meets and at each meet we averaged 13 officials on pool deck – figures which I am sure, many other Regions would wish to aspire.

In addition to officiating at local club meets many of our technical officials continue to officiate at state, national and school meets.

To those officials who were on pool deck at various meets throughout the season, we thank each and every one of you for the many hours of your time you have freely given to the sport of swimming, the clubs and the swimmers. Many thanks to our Chief Referee Alan Smith for the tremendous effort and hours he put in organising and co coordinating our team of officials.

Special congratulations and a big thank you must go to Sharon Wicking who was awarded our “Technical Official of the Year” for her efforts.

Special congratulations to Karen Macleod for being appointed to the Technical Committee of Swimming Australia and to our chief referee Alan Smith who was appointed to the Technical Committee of Swimming Queensland.

We would also like to take this opportunity to congratulate our Gold Coast technical official Maree Oberg who has been appointed as a FINA List #18 (International Starter). Maree has been along time supporter and technical official here on the Gold Coast and we wish her well on her appointment.

State Relay Team

We had 119 swimmers make themselves available and some 47 swimmers were chosen to represent the Region at the Regional Relay Events held at State Titles and we thank those swimmers for their participation. Our swimmers did extremely well coming away with some 12 medals – 6 gold, 5 silver and 1 bronze.

We would also like to acknowledge the tremendous effort put in by Kim Cook in organising the swimmers for the relay teams.

Presentation Day

Our fifth Annual Presentation Day was held in June 2015. Throughout the season points are awarded to swimmers based on number of criteria (including participation in Regional Relay teams at State and participation in our Regional Championships (winter and summer). From accounts it was another successful and enjoyable weekend meet, with some great performances in the pool from the kids. ➤ *Junior Skills Clinics, January 2015*
