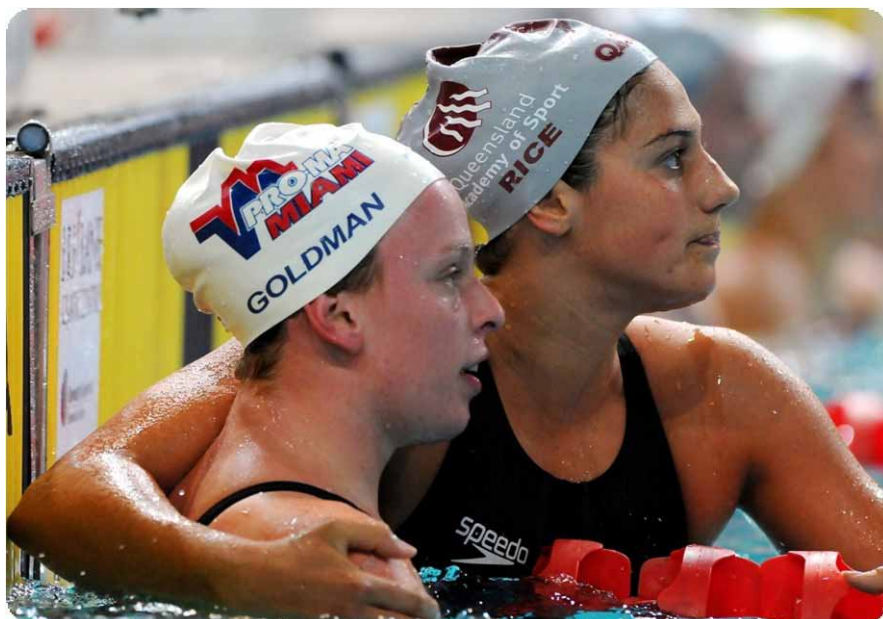

# *PRESIDENT'S AND CEO'S REPORT*

---

We have pleasure in submitting to members this report on Swimming Queensland's activities during the 2009/10 financial year.

## **2009 Rome World Championships**

The pinnacle event for the year was the 13<sup>th</sup> FINA World Championships in Rome, which produced superb performances by several Queensland swimmers and underlined the outstanding calibre of Queensland's leading coaches.

On the back of more than a decade of uncompromising dedication to long distance swimming, and after overcoming a series of setbacks, Melissa Gorman richly deserved her gold medal in the Women's 5km Open Water Championship, in which she defeated the Olympic Champion, Russian Larisa Ilchenko, in a nail-biting sprint finish. The Russian champion was seeking her sixth consecutive world title in the event.

Jessica Schipper OAM, with whom Melissa trained for several years at Redcliffe, reclaimed her crown as the best female Butterfly swimmer in the world by winning the Women's 200m Butterfly in world record time and finishing second in the 100m Butterfly. Jessica capped off a great year by winning the 2009 Swimming Australia Telstra Swimmer of the Year Award, Swimmer's Swimmer of the Year Award and People's Choice Award, while her coach, Stephan Widmer OAM, was named Coach of the Year.

Joining Melissa and Jessica as World Champion was Brenton Rickard, who won the Men's 100m Breaststroke, breaking the world record in the process. Like Melissa, Brenton had served a long, patient apprenticeship before realising his ambition. He became the first Australian man in 45 years to win a world or Olympic title in Breaststroke.

The exceptional achievements of these three great champions and swimming ambassadors were complemented by Trent Grimsey, silver medallist in the Men's 25km event; Stephanie Rice OAM, silver medallist in the Women's 200m IM and bronze medallist in the 400m IM; Cate Campbell, bronze medallist in the Women's 50m Freestyle; Emily Seebohm OAM, bronze medallist in the Women's 100m Backstroke; and Christian Sprenger, bronze medallist in the Men's 200m Breaststroke, in which he broke the world record in winning his semi-final.

Queensland swimmers and coaches made up more than half the Australian team.

## **IPC World Short Course Championships**

The three Queensland swimmers selected on the Australian team for the 2009 IPC World Championships, Michael Anderson, Brenden Hall and Blake Cochrane, each won an individual gold medal at the Championships. Brendan set a new world record in winning the Men's 400m Freestyle S9, while Michael won a second gold medal as a member of the Men's 4 x 100m Freestyle relay, which also broke the world record.

## **2009 Global Games**

The 2009 Global Games – the world's largest multi-sport competition for athletes with an intellectual disability – were held in Liverec in the Czech Republic.

Chandler Swimming Club's Nerice Holland was the star performer at the Games. In a phenomenal display of her swimming talent, Nerice won 13 gold medals. In due recognition of her remarkable achievement, Nerice received the Queensland Sport Athlete with Disability Award and Swimming Australia's Swimmer with Disability of the Year Award.

## **2009 Australian Short Course Championships**

Eight Queensland swimmers won 15 gold medals at the 2009 Australian Short Course Championships. World records were set at the Championships by Jessicah Schipper (100m Butterfly), Emily Seebohm (100m IM), and Christian Sprenger (200m Breaststroke).

## **2009 Swimming Australia State Teams Short Course Championships**

The inaugural State Teams Short Course Championships were held in Canberra in September and catered for female swimmers aged from 13 to 16 years and male swimmers aged from 14 to 17 years.

The 40-member Queensland team, under the astute tactical leadership of coaches Matt Brown, Jason Cooper and Shaun Crow, won the Championships and claimed six of the eight team trophies, including both the male and female team trophies and the 'Average Trophy' for total points per swimmer.

## **2010 Australian Open Championships**

The 2010 Australian Open Championships served as the selection trial for the 2010 Pan Pac Championships. For the fifth year in succession, Queensland swimmers comprised over half the national open team selected from performances at the Open Championships.

Our female swimmers once again topped the points score, with our men finishing in second position. Twenty-three Queensland swimmers won a total of 35 individual gold medals. Just three years ago, 11 Queensland swimmers won 18 gold medals at the Open Championships.

## **2010 Australian Open Water Swimming Championships**

World Open Water Swimming Champion, Melissa Gorman, won the Women's 10 km event at the 2010 Australian Open Water Championships. Trent Grimsey claimed the gold medal in the Men's 5km event. Trent's feat was matched by Brenden Hall in the Men's 5km multi-class event.

In age group events, Queensland swimmers won 12 gold medals, with Joshua Richardson, Nathan Barrett, and Tash Harrison dual gold medallists.



## **2010 Australian Age Championships**

Queensland swimmers and their coaches backed up their amazing performance at the 2009 Australian Age Championships with an equally impressive display at the 2010 Championships. In all, 41 Queenslanders, under the guidance of 20 coaches from six of the seven Queensland regions, won a total of 79 individual gold medals. Queensland, for the second year running, scored more points than all the other States combined.

Similar to what has occurred over recent years at the Australian Open Championships, this result outstripped the tally achieved at previous Age Championships. For example, in 2003, 18 Queensland age swimmers, with 10 coaches, amassed 46 gold medals.

Stand-out performers for Queensland were Jayden Hadler, with six gold medals; Regan Leong, five gold medals; Emily Seeböhm, six gold medals; and Amy Levings, Amy Allen, and Yolane Kukla, each of whom won four gold medals.

Four Queensland clubs featured in the top 10 of the final point score, with St Peter's Western topping the list. Queensland had the distinction of winning the W.B. Phillips Trophy – Premiership State for the 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive year.

Another encouraging statistic coming out of the past two Australian Age Championships, indicative of the depth and quality of our coaching ranks, is that 27 individual Queensland coaches had at least one swimmer win an individual gold medal at one or both of those Championships.

## **2009 Queensland Championships**

Nominations for the 2009 Queensland Championships totalled 6,416, and involved 2,195 swimmers from 165 clubs and international federations.

The major Championship awards were won by Jayden Hadler (Swimmer of the Meet), Mikkayla Maselli-Sheridan (Age Group Swimmer of the Meet), Regan Leong (Country Swimmer of the Meet), and Brenden Hall (SWD Swimmer of the Meet). St Peter's Western sustained its golden run by taking out the President's Award for Champion Club.

## **Athlete and Coach Development**

A trip to Paris and London early in the season, jointly funded by Swimming Queensland and the Queensland Academy of Sport, gave 13 young Queensland swimmers and three coaches crucial experience, and compelling motivation, as the 2012 London Olympic Games loom on the horizon. The youngest member of the team, 13 year-old Yolane Kukla demonstrated the benefit she derived from the trip by winning two gold medals at the 2010 Australian Open Swimming Championships.

Another off-shore excursion under Swimming Queensland's extensive athlete and coach development program was to the New Zealand Short Course Championships. Twelve swimmers from the Gold and Silver Squads, accompanied by three coaches, competed at the meet.

A major change to the Junior Development Squad and Bronze Squad programs was enthusiastically embraced by Squad members. Offers of free consultations locally with a sport psychologist and a physiotherapist were taken up by 142 swimmers at Cairns, Townsville, Mackay, Rockhampton, Gladstone, Bundaberg, Noosa, Toowoomba, Brisbane and Southport. As a result of the very positive feedback received from participating swimmers, this opportunity will continue to be provided to these squads.

A camp for the Junior Flippers Squad at Southport catered for 21 swimmers and five coaches, while a team of Youth Flippers and Silver Squad members (15 swimmers and five coaches) attended the Australian Institute of Sport meet in Canberra.

Financial support was provided to open water swimmers, swimmers with disability and regional swimmers to help them access competition to support their development.

Operational plans for the delivery of athlete development activities at regional level were formulated collaboratively between Swimming Queensland and Regional Associations to achieve a smooth integration of those activities with Swimming Queensland's strategies.

Swimming Queensland's 2009/10 squads comprised 485 swimmers.

Coach education and accreditation courses were delivered at various centres. Junior Squad/Assistant Coach courses were held for 216 participants at Bundaberg, Broadbeach, Buderim, Ipswich, Mareeba, Oakey, Proserpine, Yeppoon, Tully, Brisbane, Chinchilla, Toowoomba, Weipa and Rockhampton; a Silver Licence course was delivered at Broadbeach (42 participants); and Bronze Licence courses were conducted in Brisbane and at Broadbeach (43 participants). Various coach mentoring activities were undertaken in partnership with ascta (QLD) and the Queensland Academy of Sport, including Head Coach visits to club programs, workshops, scholarships, and the linking of emerging coaches with elite coaches at the Australian Short Course Championships.

### **Technical Official Development**

Swimming Queensland Technical Officials were provided with a host of development opportunities during the year. A forum for Referees held at the Queensland Championships was attended by 43 officials, with another 24 officials participating in a clinic for regional Inspectors of Turns and Judges of Strokes at Chandler.

Swimming Queensland's successful mentoring program catered for 22 officials, and incorporated the Queensland Championships, Swimming Australia's State Teams Short Course Championships in Canberra, the New Zealand Spring Meet, the New South Wales Open Water Swimming Championships, and the New South Wales Open Championships.

Karen Macleod, Swimming Queensland's Chief Referee, has been appointed as the Australian Technical Official for the 2010 FINA World Short Course Championships in Dubai.

Members of Swimming Queensland's Technical Sub-Committee assessed each of the Regional Championships and provided feedback to the respective Regional Associations.



## **Membership Development**

A wide array of activities was conducted to attract, welcome, inform, recognise, and encourage junior swimmers.

The Macca's Mini Meet program, which was launched in 2008/9, is proving to be an extremely popular initiative, with 58 Queensland swim schools participating during 2009/10. Other tried and tested grass roots programs delivered during the year included the McDonald's Participation and Improvement Programs, the Swim Star Program, and Junior Excellence (JX). A record number of Queensland swimmers (3,503) qualified for JX.

Clinics for swimmers with disability were held in Brisbane, Gladstone, Toowoomba and Townsville, while a successful pilot of a fun meet for children with special needs was conducted at Albany Creek. The fun meet attracted 110 children, 28 school teachers, and 30 learn to swim teachers. An application for funding under the Queensland Government's new Active Inclusion Program has been submitted with the aim of holding this type of event at various locations around the State.

To recognise swimmers who have been members of Swimming Queensland for at least five years, special key rings were commissioned and distributed to clubs for presentation to the swimmers concerned.

## **Awards**

One of Queensland's greatest ever swimmers with disability, Chantel Wolfenden OAM, was inducted into the Swimming Queensland Hall of Fame at the Queensland Championships. Chantel, who retired from competitive swimming in 2006, won the 400m Freestyle at the 2002 World Championships, and six Paralympic medals in 2004, including the gold medal in the 400m Freestyle. Also inducted in the Hall of Fame was Dr Tim Barrett OAM, one of Queensland's finest and most dedicated administrators, who has served our sport with distinction for nearly half a century.

Life Membership of Swimming Queensland was conferred on former Swimming Queensland Board member and Treasurer, Peter Plumridge, and coaches Michael Bohl OAM and Scott Volkers. Swimming Australia Life Membership was awarded to Margaret Pugh OAM.

Swimming Queensland Awards of Excellence were presented to James Crompton (FNQ), Steve Argent (NQ), David Milburn (CQ), Dale Cox (WB), David Sondergeld (DD), Karen Macleod (GC), and Gary Shepherdson (Brisbane).

The Order of Australia Medal was awarded to coaches Stephan Widmer and Michael Bohl in the 2010 Australia Day honours list, while Nerice Holland received the Queensland Sport Athlete with Disability Award and Swimming Australia's Swimmer with Disability of the Year Award.

Other winners of Swimming Australia Awards were Jessicah Schipper, Melissa Gorman, Brenton Rickard, Stephan Widmer, Drew McGregor, Ken Wood, Denis Cotterell, and Ellen Fullerton.

## General

During the year, Swimming Queensland and Queensland Masters Swimming entered into a formal agreement for the provision of administrative support by Swimming Queensland to Queensland Masters Swimming on a fee-for-service basis. The agreement takes advantage of the economies of scale generated through one administration servicing both organisations, and the quality and depth of resources available within Swimming Queensland.

Swimming Queensland's excellent relationship with the Queensland Academy of Sport was expanded to include the transfer to Swimming Queensland of the Head Coach position from the Academy's organisational structure. Under a formal agreement between the two organisations, the position will continue to be fully funded by the QAS. This new arrangement will enable the Head Coach to be deployed more effectively in the development and mentoring of coaches in the sport of swimming.

## Acknowledgements

Swimming Queensland relies on the generosity and skills of thousands of volunteers each year in performing its role as the peak body for swimming in this State. This reliance extends back 112 years to when the organisation was established. It is impossible to calculate how many individuals have served the sport in one way or another over that period, but the figure must surely be several hundred thousand. The number of people to whom Life Membership of Swimming Queensland has been awarded for long and meritorious service with the Association now stands at 101.

This selfless contribution to swimming by so many has culminated in Queensland now enjoying an era of unprecedented success. In the first 86 years of Swimming Queensland's existence, only one Queenslander won an individual gold medal in swimming at an Olympic Games. Since then another nine Queenslanders have achieved that feat, six of them during the past decade.

On behalf of Swimming Queensland, we once again offer our heartfelt thanks to all who help us to nurture the sport of swimming and to protect and build on the rich legacy of generations reaching all the way back to 1898.

Included in that group are the Queensland Government and our sponsors – McDonald's, Retravision, Commonwealth Bank, Speedo, Swimmeroo, and Telstra. Swimming Queensland is pleased to be able to provide a wide range of opportunities and experiences to our swimmers. Without Government and sponsor support, those opportunities would be significantly diminished.

# *TREASURER'S REPORT*

---

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I submit the Treasurer's Annual Report, together with the audited Annual Financial Report, for the year ended 30 April 2010.


An operating surplus of \$47,176 was recorded by the Association in the 2009/10 financial year, taking Total Accumulated Funds to \$545,008.

Total revenue for the year was \$1.987m, an increase of \$507,000 on 2008/9, while total expenditure grew from \$1.464m to \$1.940m. These changes largely resulted from:

- an expanded relationship with the Queensland Academy of Sport, under which its Head Coach position has been transferred to Swimming Queensland and fully funded by the QAS;
- a Service Level Agreement entered into with Queensland Masters Swimming for the provision of administrative support by SQ on a fee-for-service basis;
- a grant from the Queensland Government to assist with the establishment of a closer strategic and operational relationship between SQ and QMS; and
- further growth in cash and in-kind sponsorship.

The organisation remains in a strong financial position.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation to my fellow members of the Finance Sub-Committee: SQ Directors Mr John Keppie OAM, Mrs Suellen Hardie, and Mr John Dove, and Mr Michael Cox, B. Bus. CPA.

**Note 1 - Statement of Significant Accounting Policies**

The financial statements are a general purpose financial report and have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the AASB and the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act. The financial statements have also been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non current assets (where applicable) and financial assets and liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

The financial report covers Queensland Swimming Association Inc. which is incorporated under the Associations Incorporations Act 1981 and is domiciled in Brisbane Queensland.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

**Income Tax**

No provision has been made for income tax as the Association is exempt under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

**Inventories**

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and current replacement cost. Costs are assigned on a first-in first out basis.

**Property, Plant & Equipment**

Property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows, which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amount.

**Depreciation**

The depreciable amounts of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, are depreciated over their useful lives to the entity commencing from the time that the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements. Depreciation rates are Plant & equipment 7.5% to 75%, leasehold improvements 10% and Historical Gallery 10%.

**Leases**

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not legal ownership, are transferred to the association are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised, recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual value. Leased assets are amortised over their estimated useful lives. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense of the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

**Financial Instruments**

Financial instruments are initially measured at cost on trade date, which includes transaction costs, when the related contractual obligation or right exists. Subsequent to initial recognition these instruments are measured dependent on whether they are classified as Financial Assets at fair value through profit and loss, loans and receivables, held to maturity investments, available for sale financial assets or financial liabilities.

**Employee Benefits**

Provision is made for the liability for employees arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on costs. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the association to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

**Government Grants**

Government grants are recognised at fair value when the entity obtains control of the grant, it is probable that the economic benefits will flow and the grant can be measured reliably.

**Revenues**

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon delivery of the goods to customers. Revenue from rendering a service is recognised upon delivery of the service. Interest income is recognised on an accruals basis.

**Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

**Impairment of Assets**

At each reporting date, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indicator exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the assets fair value less costs to sell and value in use is compared to the assets carrying value. Any excess of the assets carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

**Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments**

The committee members evaluate estimates and judgments incorporated into the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the association.

This season has continued as a period of change for the association which has continued with its support of development trips which have been co-ordinated through the office of Swimming Queensland. Three Torpedo teams were sent away to Toowoomba/Warwick; Gladstone and Pittsworth with 40 swimmers on each team. From all accounts, swimmers, coaches and managers alike, had an excellent time all of which proved to be a valuable experience.

Changes initiated by Swimming Queensland to the Patrons Shield resulted in, for the first time, two teams from Brisbane being fielded to attend the competition meet. Whilst these teams met with varying success, there were numerous outstanding individual results with both teams enjoying the level of competition. Your association also held two very successful McDonald's Junior Clinics which were well attended by over 200 swimmers. I would also like to take this opportunity on behalf of the Region to congratulate Maree Oberg and Sharon Wicking who gained their Level 1 Referee Accreditation this season. They join with our other Gold Coast referees John Dove, Karen Macleod and Norm Fyffe.

Thanks to Janice Cole, Kim Cook, Scott Harrison and Ken Sabotic who managed our Gold Coast teams for events such as the Regional Relay Team for State Titles, the Water Dragons meet and The Patrons Shield.

This year, Swimming Gold Coast had 1086 competitive, 470 recreational swimmers, 13 officials, 426 parents and non-swimmers and 24 clubs registered with the Region. The Region welcomed a new club which was formed throughout the season – Super Fish Swimming Club.

On the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2009, Swimming Gold Coast conducted their Winter Short Course Championships attracting some 331 athletes from 31 clubs.

On the week-end of the 12<sup>th</sup> to the 14<sup>th</sup> March 2010, the Region held its Regional Championships attracting 342 athletes from 18 Gold Coast Clubs and 5 international teams. Congratulations to PBC Swim Club who are the champion Gold Coast Club this season winning the Championships with a point score of 1,153 points followed by Pro-Ma Miami on 915 points and Nerang Swim Club coming in 3<sup>rd</sup> on 700.5 points.

This season Swimming Gold Coast hosted the Patrons Shield between the Gold Coast, Brisbane Torpedos Red, Brisbane Torpedos Green and Darling Downs Region. It is the first time Gold Coast has hosted this event and with the support of All Saints Swim Club and their parents, the day was a great success. Our Gold Coast swimmers won the meet with 635 points followed by Brisbane Red team on 522, Brisbane Green on 369 and Darling Downs on 366 points.



Our swimmers from the Gold Coast region performed exceptionally well throughout the 2009-2010 season, at State, National and International level.

Our swimmers did exceptionally well this season and Swimming Gold Coast would like to take this opportunity to recognise and congratulate the Gold Coast swimmers on their selection in various teams.

Sasha Bosworth (Sports Scientist) put the swimmers through some swim specific core strengthening exercises. Bernadette Baker (Physiotherapist) discussed the physical activity benefits of our sport and the dietary requirements of Junior Swimmers with the parents and swimmers. Ray Henderson ran a series of Technical Officials forums for parents wishing to gain accreditation. The weekend was very well organized and the feedback has been positive.

Following the Country Championships a clinic was held in Goondiwindi on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> January for all interested swimmers. However as with any Development programs there is room for improvement and therefore the Association is keen to run it again next season implementing helpful ideas gained from feedback. This is an evolving process, but one which is important to swimming on the Downs, continuing to assist our swimmers to the "next level". The majority of our Regions development programs involve the swimmers being in the JX program. For many of the swimmers this is an achievable goal.

#### **Registration System**

On the 19<sup>th</sup> September the DDRSA hosted a workshop presented by Gloria Williams and Dinah Glykidis from Swimming Queensland. They presented a forum on the registration system and addressed any issues the clubs had. The Association also welcomes the innovation of giving the Association access to registrations of our members in this Region. This is an important step and evolving but one that is needed.

#### **Accreditation of Technical Officials**

The Association under the guidance from Ray Henderson continued with a program to increase the number of Accredited Officials on the Downs. With the Assessors and Trainers assistance this program has been a success with approximately 49 new Accredited Officials in various positions and 18 Accredited Officials continuing with further accreditation.

Also John Cooper and Laurie Passante attended Swimming Queensland's Mentor Program and reported it was a tremendous learning experience.

#### **Regional Events**

The Regional Championships were held in Toowoomba on the 6<sup>th</sup>- 7<sup>th</sup> March 2010. Even though the weather was against us the standard of swimming was very high and the Championships ran smoothly with keen officials and volunteers helping over the weekend. Mr. Greg Kukla (Director of Swimming Queensland) attended the Championships and his input was most welcome.

The Country Championships were held in Goondiwindi on the 15<sup>th</sup> January. This continues to be an important event in the Region's Calendar as it provides country swimmers and clubs a chance to lift their profile outside Toowoomba.

It has been another successful year for CQ swimmers.

At the State Championships in December 2009, CQ Clubs were represented and swimmers recorded excellent times, many making finals and several winning individual medals. Our

Regional Relays performed well and the 14 yrs and under boys' team (Alex Williams, Chris Hansen, Jared O'Hanlon & Liam Rayfield) placed first in their medley and second in the freestyle relay events. CQ's 10 yrs and under girls' team also swam very well, placing a close fourth in both their relay events. Central Queensland was represented in all but two relays, and all team members as well as those nominated for section, are thanked for making themselves available.

Rocky City swimmers won the Country Club award and the club is congratulated on this fine achievement.

CQ was represented at most national championship events. Coaches Caroline Hayes, Jodie Shanks and Shane Kingston, as well as the supporting coaches in their programs, are congratulated on their commitments to developing our sport in Central Queensland.

The Queensland Sprint Meet in February attracted entries from 15 CQ clubs and those swimmers in our region and, given recent results, this talent is already showing through. Congratulations to Caribee Swimming Club for being acknowledged as one of the top three Australian Clubs again in 2009.

Our AGM is now upon us. I want to thank the members of our CQ committee for their efforts in the past season and as they are all standing for re-election, I ask club delegates to support their nominations. The retiring committee has an excellent working relationship with Swimming Queensland and I believe this has provided and will continue to provide benefits for our swimmers and our region. Unable to continue as record steward, I thank Toni English for her assistance this past year.

McDonald's became a major sponsor of Swimming Queensland and our regional association has benefited from 'cash and goods' flowing into association funds (to the value of \$10,000.00). Additionally this season, SQ provided a cash contribution of \$2,500 to our association. Unfortunately, with the withdrawal of Zoggs as a sponsor, the Zoggs clinics will no longer be conducted. However I am advised that other swimmer development activities will replace them. Management is also advised that the format of the 2010/11 JX activities will be different to the format used this past season. (At present, the committee is unaware of what this will be.)

SQ has circulated country clubs about conducting an inaugural Queensland Country Championships, proposed to be held in Gladstone on 14 and 15 January 2011. A response to the proposal has been requested by the 30 June 2010 and, while it is not confirmed, management feels this meet will likely proceed.

FNQ has also proposed a 3-way meet between CQ/NQ/FNQ, with the suggestion that team selection be made from the results at regional championships; that the age groups commence at 13 yrs of age, and that meet, rotating between the three regions, be held as an additional qualifying meet leading into the Australian Age Championships. Nothing further has been discussed at this time.

The association Sprint Meet in January – again attracting nominations from other regions – was used to provide eligible CQ swimmers (identified from the SQ JX age divisions 10, 11 & 12 in 2008/2009) with free entry into their age group events. The meet included a JX (Boys v Girls) points score competition, based on swimmer average points, which the boys' team won. The meet also provided our swimmers with a timely hit-out prior to the Queensland Sprint Championships in February which suits more of our inland clubs to attend. The commencement of Queensland country championships may require this sprint competition to be relocated, but

management will wait on confirmation from SQ before making its decision. Caribee Swimming Club hosted the meet in 2010 and their committee and members are thanked for providing this important competition for our swimmers.

McDonald's 2010 Central Queensland Championships was hosted by Gladstone Swimming Club and the committee and members of the club are congratulated on a job very well done. The meet ran smoothly and throughout the whole weekend competition was exciting. The Caribee Swimming Club is congratulated on winning the Martin Hansen 'High Point Club Trophy'. As well as the applied chemical trophy; Rocky City placed second and Gladstone club placed third. The three new aggregate points awards - providing acknowledgement for clubs competing with smaller representative numbers - were won by SBU Saints, Rocky City and Western Suburbs.

This committee is grateful for and acknowledges the support received from McDonald's and their Gladstone franchisee, Mr Ron Hawkins, was a welcome spectator on both Saturday and Sunday afternoons and very kindly presented the major awards of the meet. Retravision again generously provide vouchers that the Association could use to acknowledge the efforts of our referees, coaches and timekeepers.

Your Association also thanks Swimming Queensland for support received throughout the year and for sending representatives (Dr Simon Hooton and Mr Peter Crane) to attend the meet. Both men were available to answer questions from any association member.

**Clubs interested in hosting either the sprint meet or CQ Championships (or both) in 2011 should indicate their interest by 30 September 2010.**

The emerging squad camp at the Rockhampton Grammar School also incorporated the Rockhampton JX Clinic and, with 14 yr old Yolane Kukla and her coach Michael Palfery in attendance, it provided a great opportunity for all our swimmers and coaches. All swimmers gained an insight into what is possible with commitment and hard work, and with Yolane having the distinction of being one of our newest Australian representatives, those who swam beside her that afternoon would realise that anything is possible and age should never be considered a barrier.

Technical Official numbers are beginning to grow slowly but there are still many clubs that have none or insufficient qualified officials. Clubs should encourage and support their members to gain this important qualification. It is a great way to be involved and others will be encouraged to become qualified as well. The service you provide our swimmers prepares them for competitions well beyond club night and local meets and officiating at meets is a great way to make a positive contribution to your club and children. To those technical officials who assist other clubs throughout the year, I thank you.

### **Looking towards 2010-2011**

Our association must be proactive in providing opportunities for our swimmers and their coaches. By so doing, clubs will retain role models for young swimmers to look up to, while at the same time, the strength of CQ swimming will continue to grow as our swimmers demonstrate their abilities to the rest of Queensland.

Your management committee is presently indentifying suitable meets that would provide emerging squad team opportunity in this and the future years. It is felt such forward planning will be beneficial to swimmers and their coaches. Interstate and New Zealand meets are being



reviewed for this purpose and budget costs prepared for management consideration. The criteria for team selection have not been discussed at this time.

Grant opportunities and funding assistance continue to be actively pursued and McDonald's is again providing cash sponsorship (\$5,000) as well as in-kind support.

Providing education and development opportunities are ongoing objectives for the Association. It is the subject of many grant applications targeted at providing self improvement opportunities for our swimmers, technical officials, coaches, volunteers and clubs.

Initiatives already taken by management are helping, but it is what happens at club level that is most important for swimmers. Our children have the potential to achieve anything they set their minds to, but during their formative years, support from clubs, committees and coaches is essential in helping them develop the individual skills that will allow them to reach their full potential.

All our children are benefiting from our collective efforts and it is exciting to see the speed and promise that CQ swimmers are showing us.
