PRESIDENT'S AND CEO'S REPORT

We have pleasure in submitting to members this report on Swimming Queensland's activities during the 2010/11 financial year.

2010 Commonwealth Games

Queensland led the way in Australia's dominant performance at the 2010 Delhi Commonwealth Games, with every gold medal in able-bodied individual events being won by a current or former Queensland swimmer. Alicia Coutt's scintillating display reaped her five gold medals and the honour of carrying the Australian flag at the closing ceremony. Other Queensland swimmers to stand on the top tier of the presentation dais in individual events were Sophie Edington, Yolane Kukla, Meagen Nay, Kylie Palmer, Leiston Pickett, Jessicah Schipper, Emily Seebohm, and Brenton Rickard.

Queenslanders made up half the Australian swimming team. They were joined by coaches Glenn Baker, Michael Bohl, Matthew Brown, Denis Cotterell, Michael Palfery, Brian Stehr, and Stephan Widmer.

2010 Pan Pacific Championships

The 2010 Pan Pacific Championships, held in Irvine, California, also showcased Queensland's sparkling talent pool, with our swimmers claiming five of Australia's six gold medals and 10 of its 14 silver medals. Gold medal winners were Emily Seebohm, Melissa Gorman, Jessicah Schipper, and Sophie Edington.

Queensland coaching members of the national team were Glenn Baker, Michael Bohl, Matt Brown, Denis Cotterell, Brian Stehr, and Stephan Widmer.

2010 IPC Swimming World Championships

Queensland swimmers performed strongly at the 2010 IPC Swimming World Championships in Eindhoven, the Netherlands, winning six medals amongst them. Brenden Hall and Blake Cochrane returned home from the Netherlands as world champions. Other Queensland medal winners were Daniel Fox, Kayla Clarke, and Marayke Jonkers.

Queensland coaches on the Australian team were Steve Hadler, Chris Phillips, and Drew McGregor.

2010 World Open Water Swimming Championships

Melissa Gorman confirmed her status as one of the world's premier open water swimmers by taking out the bronze medal in the 10 km event at the 2010 World Open Water Swimming Championships in Lac Saint-Jean, Canada.

2010 World Short Course Championships

Queensland swimmers won four medals at the 2010 World Short Course Championships in Dubai: Kylie Palmer, silver and bronze; Leiston Pickett, bronze; and Brenton Rickard, bronze.

2010 Australian Short Course Championships

Queensland topped the State point score at the 2010 Australian Short Course Championships, while Chandler was the leading club. Stand-out performers were Katie Goldman, Kylie Palmer, and Emily Seebohm.

2010 State Teams Short Course Championships

Under the astute guidance of Head Coach, Matt Brown, the Queensland team won seven of the eight State Teams Short Course Championships trophies and every relay event. Exceptional performances were recorded by Remy Fairweather, Mikkayla Sheridan, Jordan Harrison, and Mitchell Larkin.

2011 Australian Open Championships

Queensland swimmers reigned supreme at the 2011 Australian Open Championships, winning both the Corbett Shield for the women's competition, and the Keiran Shield for the men's. Based on performances at the Championships, 29 Queensland swimmers and nine Queensland coaches were named on the Australian team for the 2011 Shanghai FINA World Championships. Our contingent of swimmers once again made up more than half the national team.

2011 Australian Open Water Swimming Championships

Queensland gold medallists at the 2011 Australian Open Water Swimming Championships, which catered for both open and age swimmers, were Melissa Gorman, Ky Hurst, Joshua Richardson, Stephanie Greene, Emily Seymour, Hugh Cumming, Bonnie MacDonald, Jordan Harrison, and Suzanne Ryan.

Seven Queensland swimmers were selected on the eight-member Australian team for the 2011 World Championships. Champion club was St Peters Western.

2011 Australian Age Championships

Mikkayla Sheridan, with eight gold medals, propelled Queensland to its 12th consecutive victory at the 2011 Australian Age Championships. Other multiple winners included Tessa Wallace and Cameron McEvoy, both of whom won four titles, and Taylor Green and Jordan Harrison, with three gold medals each.

Seventeen Queensland coaches produced one or more winners at the Championships.

2010 Queensland Championships

Over the seven days of competition at the 2010 Queensland Championships, 1,575 swimmers competed in individual events, and 1,668 in the relays.

Major award winners at the Championships were Emily Seebohm (Swimmer of the Meet), Madeline Groves (Age Group Swimmer of the Meet), Regan Leong (Country Swimmer of the Meet), and Brenden Hall (SWD Swimmer of the Meet).

The President's Trophy, for leading club, was won once again by St Peter's Western.

Athlete and Coach Development

A team of 17 Gold and Silver Squad swimmers and seven coaches attended a training camp in Beijing before participating in the 2010 Chinese National Youth Championships. Another 15 swimmers, also members of the Gold and Silver Squads, supported by three coaches, competed at the 2010 New Zealand Short Course Championships in Wellington.

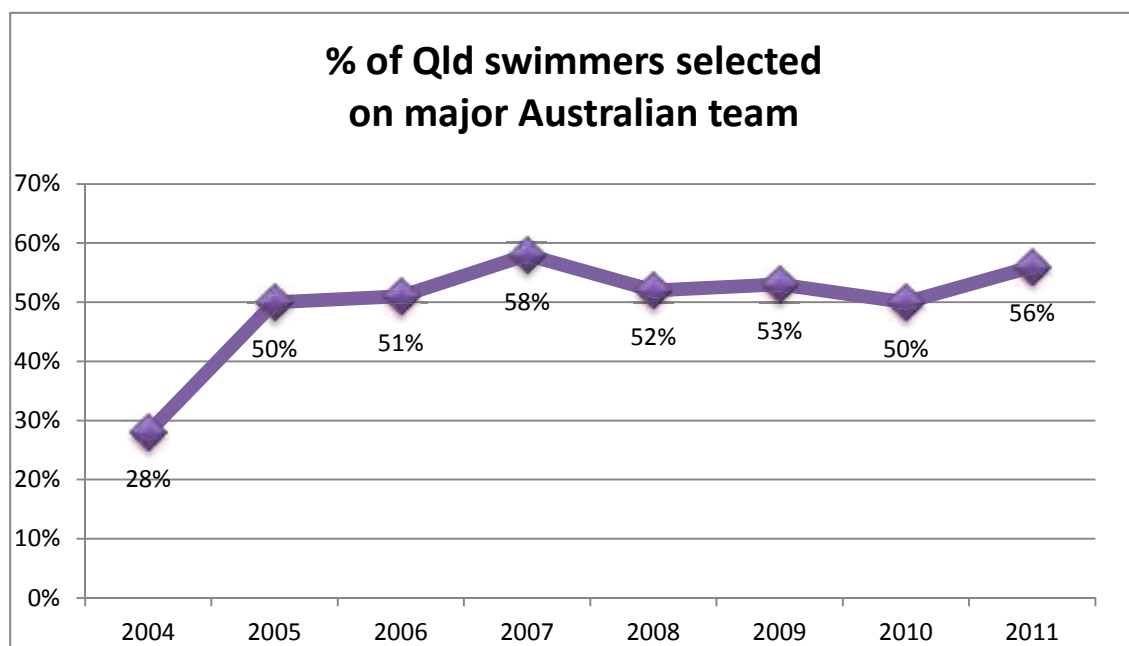
Other development activities included the annual trip to the Great Barrier Reef swim meet in Mackay for Bronze Squad members, sports medicine (sport psychology, physiotherapy and nutrition) consultations at several centres for members of the Bronze and Junior Development Squads, and a camp at the Gold coast for the Silver, Youth Flippers and Junior Flippers Squads.

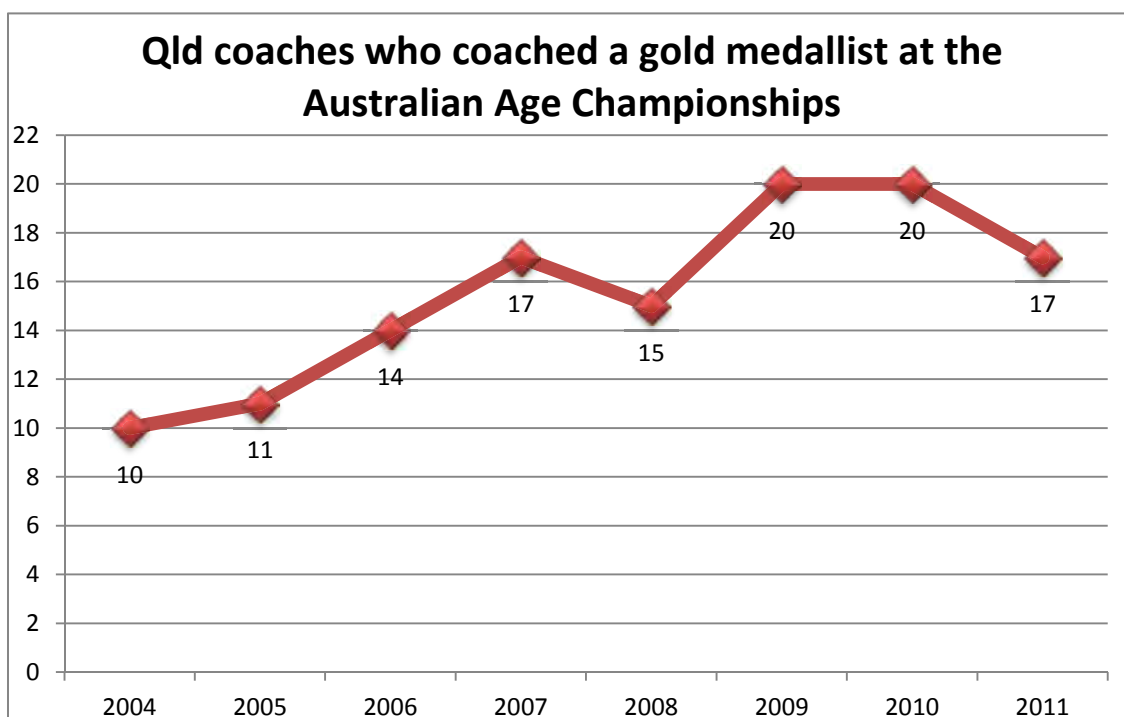
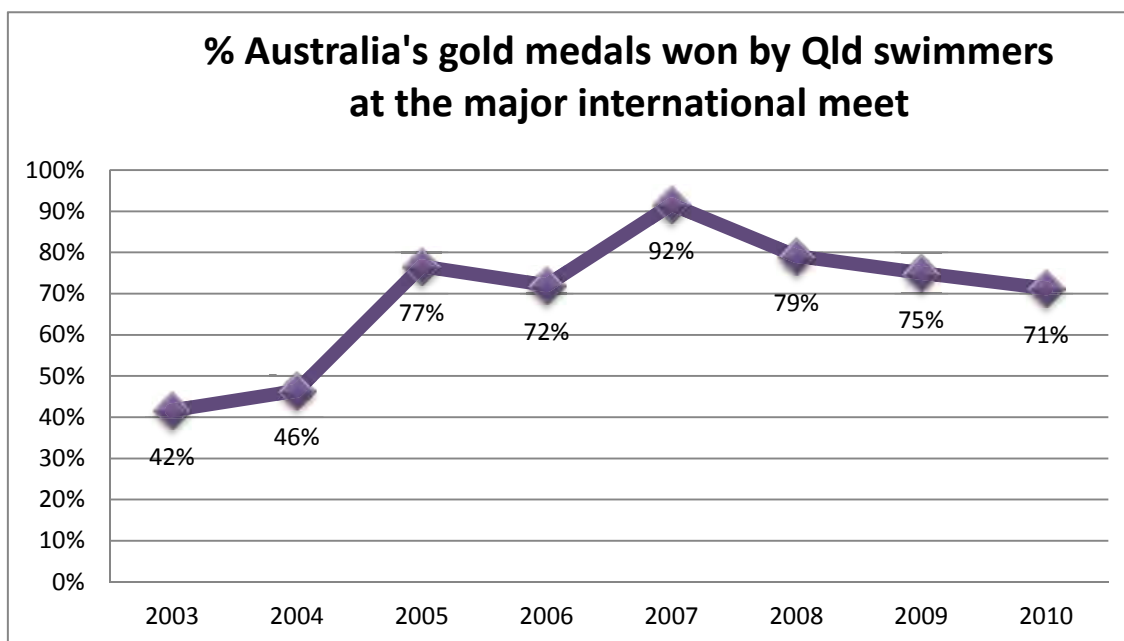
The newly created Junior Platinum Squad, for 12 year-old girls and 13 year-old boys, visited the Queensland Academy of Sport, where squad members were filmed with underwater cameras before having lunch with several current and former champion swimmers. They also spent a weekend at the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra.

Financial assistance to access strong competition was provided to regional members of various Swimming Queensland development squads.

Coach education and accreditation courses, including SWD and OWS, were delivered at several locations. Coach mentoring activities included visits by Swimming Queensland's Mentor Coach, Scott Volkers, to all regions and a number of workshops at the Queensland Academy of Sport.

Swimming Queensland's 2010/11 athlete development squads comprised 429 swimmers.





Technical Official Development

Mentoring was provided to Queensland Technical Officials at the New Zealand Short Course Championships, New South Wales Championships, State Teams Short Course Championships, SAL Summer Series in Sydney, and the Queensland Championships. Financial support was also provided to two officials to work at the Pan Pacific Championships in California.

Forums were held for Referees and Starters, and a technical seminar was conducted for clubs located in the Brisbane region.

Membership Development

A resource DVD, Growing Up In Lycra, was produced by Swimming Queensland for young female swimmers, their parents and their coaches, and distributed to nearly 5,000 female members in Queensland aged 11 years and over, and to approximately 3,000 Australian Swim Coaches and Teachers Association members around Australia. Swimming Queensland received generous assistance from the Queensland Government, ascta, Leisel Jones and several sport professionals, including physiotherapist Rachel Vickery, in the making of Growing Up In Lycra.

Topics covered on the DVD include body image and posture, menstrual cycle (specifically with respect to sport), self-esteem, dealing with pressure, depression and bullying, and the role of the parent. The DVD aims to raise awareness of these issues and to provide strategies to ensure that involvement in swimming is a positive experience for our young athletes. Swimming Queensland has made Growing Up In Lycra available to other sports.

The popular Macca's Mini Meet program, introduced by Swimming Queensland a couple of years ago, grew significantly to reach 15,000 children at 77 Swim Australia swim schools across Queensland.

The number of Queensland swimmers who qualified for the very successful national JX program, developed by Swimming Queensland in 2006, climbed to over 3,600.

Participation Fun Days, a new Swimming Queensland initiative for children with special needs successfully piloted last year, were held at Townsville, Rockhampton, Cairns, Nambour, Brisbane, and the Gold Coast. They attracted 454 children, 137 school teachers and 93 learn to swim teachers. Organised and led by Swimming Queensland's Disability Manager, Wendy Ross, the Participation Fun Days promote water confidence and water familiarisation, body control and mobility, and water safety. They also provide teachers and carers with structured aquatic guidance in the water with children who have special needs. Swimmer With Disability clinics were also conducted at various centres in partnership with Sporting Wheelies, with 156 participants.

Other membership development activities included several well established programs, such as the Swim Star cap program, new member kits, participation ribbons, and the Participation and Improvement programs.

Awards

The prestige of the Swimming Queensland Hall of Fame was enriched by the induction of Hayley Lewis and Jade Edmiston. Hayley's brilliant career, spanning more than a decade, included six World Championship medals and seven Commonwealth Games gold medals. One of Queensland's most outstanding breaststrokers, Jade won eight medals at World Championships, half of which were gold.

Swimming Queensland Life Membership was awarded to Wendy Ryan in recognition of her long and meritorious service to swimming in Queensland. Wendy has been continuously involved with swimming for 40 years in the Central Queensland region.

Swimming Queensland Awards of Excellence were presented to Jessica Sallaway (WB), David White (DD), Dianne Greene (Brisbane), Warren Grainger (Brisbane), Graham Simpson (CQ), and Theresa Manning (NQ).

Julie McGinley received due recognition of her outstanding contribution to swimming by being awarded the Order of Australia Medal in the Queen's Birthday Honours List. Julie has been a dedicated servant to our sport for the past three decades.

Alicia Coutts capped off a remarkable year by winning the prestigious Telstra Swimmer of the Year Award for 2010 and the inaugural Swimming Queensland Susie O'Neill Award, which will be presented annually to a Queensland swimmer whose achievements are of such a high degree of

excellence that they are inspirational to the swimming community. Brenden Hall received the Queensland Athlete With A Disability Award from the Sports Federation of Queensland.

The John Keppie Award was another new initiative introduced in 2010/11. It was presented to Ted Randle for demonstrating excellence as an official and for inspiring other Technical Officials to attain greater levels, not only in their performance but also by participating at a higher level of officiating. John's own contribution to swimming over many years was recognised at the annual Queensland Sports Awards dinner, where he received the Queensland Service to Sport Award.

Acknowledgements

The past year has further cemented Queensland's status as a leader in the sport of swimming. It was a year in which our swimmers won the Australian Open, Australian Age and Australian Short Course Championships, and the State Teams Short Course Championships. Remarkably, it was also the seventh consecutive year in which Queensland swimmers comprised at least 50% of the Australian team, and the 12th year in succession that our age swimmers have topped the State point score at the Australian Age Championships.

All Queenslanders involved in our sport are constantly delighted by the accomplishments of our swimmers. They are rightfully proud of our heritage, which embodies a culture fuelled by an unquenchable thirst for excellence.

In discharging its responsibilities to stakeholders, the Board of Swimming Queensland relies on the generous support of a host of people who perform multiple roles for free. On behalf of the Board, we extend our most sincere appreciation to each and every one of you and express our hope that you are pleased with the outcomes documented in our report.

Swimming Queensland is very fortunate to have excellent partnerships with its sponsors and with the Queensland Government. Their financial and other backing enables Swimming Queensland to provide a host of opportunities for emerging swimmers and their coaches and has been a major factor in Queensland's continuing success.

TREASURER'S REPORT

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I submit the Treasurer's Annual Report, together with the audited Annual Financial Report for the year ended 30 April 2011.

An operating deficit of \$27,779 was recorded by the Association in the 2010/11 financial year, taking Total Accumulated Funds to \$517,228.

Total revenue for the year was \$2.073m, an increase of \$85,000 on 2009/10, while total expenditure rose from \$1.941m to \$2.101m. The most noteworthy changes from the previous financial year were:

- an increase of \$73,000 in income for athlete and coach development, largely due a higher financial contribution from the Queensland Academy of Sport for services provided by Swimming Queensland;
- a one-off payment of \$65,000 to Masters Swimming Queensland, recorded under Other Expenses, from amalgamation funding earlier provided by the Queensland Government; and
- an increase of \$129,000 in salaries and wages, primarily related to services performed under Swimming Queensland's partnership with the QAS.

Approximately \$300,000 of the total amount spent on salaries and wages was recouped from the four organisations for which Swimming Queensland performs professional and administrative services.


The organisation remains in a strong financial position.

It is pleasing to note that expenditure on development has changed very little, at approximately 30% of total expenditure. The level of grant income received by Swimming Queensland from the Queensland Government and Swimming Australia is forecast to decline further in 2011/12 despite Queensland's astonishing success in swimming over recent years. Swimming Queensland has been vigorous in its efforts to alert the Queensland Government and Swimming Australia to the negative impact that trend may have on Swimming Queensland's capacity to sustain its investment in its development programs if it is not arrested. This issue is a major challenge confronting the Finance Sub-Committee and the Board, and it will require expert management by both the administration and officers of the Association.

During the financial year, Swimming Queensland introduced a comprehensive formal Accounts Procedures and Policy document which reflects best practice for Not-for-Profit organisations.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank our sponsors for the past year: McDonald's, Speedo, Telstra, Commonwealth Bank, Retravisio, and Swimmeroo, and to welcome Hancock Coal for the coming financial year.

I also wish to express my appreciation to my fellow members of the Finance Sub-Committee: Mr John Keppie OAM, Ms Suellen Hardie, Mr John Dove, Mr Greg Kukla and Mr Michael Cox, B.Bus., CPA.

**Notes to and forming part of the Financial Statements
for the year ended 30th April 2011**

Note 1 - Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are a general purpose financial report and have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the AASB and the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act. The financial statements have also been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non current assets (where applicable) and financial assets and liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

The financial report covers Queensland Swimming Association Inc. which is incorporated under the Associations Incorporations Act 1981 and is domiciled in Brisbane Queensland.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Income Tax

No provision has been made for income tax as the Association is exempt under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and current replacement cost. Costs are assigned on a first-in first out basis.

Property, Plant & Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows, which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amount.

Depreciation

The depreciable amounts of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, are depreciated over their useful lives to the entity commencing from the time that the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements. Depreciation rates are Plant & equipment 7.5% to 75%, leasehold improvements 10% and Historical Gallery 10%.

Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not legal ownership, are transferred to the association are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised, recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual value. Leased assets are amortised over their estimated useful lives. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense of the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Financial Instruments

Financial instruments are initially measured at cost on trade date, which includes transaction costs, when the related contractual obligation or right exists. Subsequent to initial recognition these instruments are measured dependent on whether they are classified as Financial Assets at fair value through profit and loss, loans and receivables, held to maturity investments, available for sale financial assets or financial liabilities.

Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the liability for employees arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on costs. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the association to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Government Grants

Government grants are recognised at fair value when the entity obtains control of the grant, it is probable that the economic benefits will flow and the grant can be measured reliably.

If such an indicator exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the assets fair value less costs to sell and value in use is compared to the assets carrying value. Any excess of the assets carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the association.



It gives me great pleasure to present the Report on the activities of Swimming Gold Coast for the 2010-2011 season.

During the season our Region had some 1,559 registered swimmers (competitors and recreational), some 24 registered clubs, 33 coaches, 16 officials, 364 parents, 3 non-swimmers and 12 life members.

Our Gold Coast swimmers have excelled at local, state, national and international level with quite a number of our swimmers being selected to represent our country. Congratulations to all those swimmers for their selection in various teams.

In July 2010, we held our Winter Short Course Meet with some 272 swimmers competing and in March 2011, we held our Gold Coast Regional Championships with some 451 competitors from some 16 clubs.

Both meets ran exceptionally well and we thank Nerang Swim Club who hosted Winter Short Course Championships and to Miami Swim Club who hosted our Regional Championships.

We redesigned our website to make it more user-friendly and we take this opportunity to thank Tina Maniaco and her band of helpers Ann Stephens, Kim Cook and Michelle Sabotic for all their hard work and effort in undertaking this huge task on our behalf.

With Committees constantly changing in various clubs, the Region conducted its second Club Workshop in May of 2011, for the purpose of providing valuable information to club representatives as to how to run a successful meet. Once again, our Club Workshop was well attended and very successful, and I would take this opportunity to thank our co-ordinator Dianne Daw for her hard work and dedication for organising and presenting this seminar.

Another innovation our Region instigated this season was to encourage regular meetings with coaches in order that we might obtain their feedback and to seek from them their ideas as how the Region can better serve our swimmers. It was generally agreed that the coaches wanted to take a more active role in the design and delivery of development programs for the benefit of our swimmers and it was also agreed that the coaches would support each of our clubs by ensuring that their clubs were represented at all Gold Coast club meets. It is hoped that these meetings and exchange of ideas will become a regular occurrence.

One of the more exciting things the Region has embarked upon this season was to organise a presentation day for our swimmers. Throughout the season points were awarded to swimmers based

on number of criteria, with the swimmers being recognised for their efforts at the end of the season. Some 47 swimmers received awards of cash payments, trophies and goods from various sponsors.

The President's award was given to Bonnie McDonald and the Rising Star award was given to Cameron McEvoy. Both swimmers excelled in their performances throughout the year and we congratulate both Bonnie and Cameron and in fact congratulate all swimmers who received awards on the day.

It is hoped that this becomes an annual event although the format of awarding points, after discussion with the coaches, may change in the forthcoming season. All in all, a very successful event and we thank particularly Di Daw and Michelle Sabotic for all of their hard work for organising this event on behalf of the Region.

During the season the Region undertook a number of Development activities commencing with a Starts and Turns Clinic held at All Saints. 45 swimmers attended this clinic under the guidance of Ian Findlay. A fantastic day was had by all and we are sure that all of the swimmers learned something from the clinic. A big thank you to Ian Findlay for his assistance with this event.

One hundred and seven swimmers represented the Region at the Regional Relay Events held at State Titles and we thank those swimmers for their participation. We would also like to acknowledge the huge effort put in by Kim Cook in organising the swimmers for the relay teams.

In September, the Region sent 47 swimmers, 6 officials and 2 coaches to represent the Region at the Australian Crawl meet. These swimmers were Gold/Silver 11, 12 and 13 year old JX Group and the trip proved to be a great team building exercise.

We also sent a team of 6 swimmers, 1 coach and a manager to represent the Region at the Great Barrier Reef meet held in September 2010.

Additionally, I acknowledge the important and ongoing efforts being made by our region's coaches in achieving this goal that we share.

Clubs are the backbone of our association. It is through regular club nights and interclub competitions that opportunities are provided for swimmers to improve, so I suggest our association should continue the initiatives that have been commenced. Initiatives that provide direct assistance to clubs to achieve specific goals of their own, as well as indirect assistance, such as: identifying and providing opportunities for our association's better swimmers to improve, knowing that experiences gained by these swimmers will be shared with others in their clubs when they return.

Similarly, by promoting and supporting the development opportunities for coaches, technical officials and club committee members, we ensure our swimmers receive the best possible opportunity to develop their talents: which in turn will assist this association to provide maximum benefits to all of our membership. At times, the grass roots of our sport can be neglected when older swimmers receive higher accolades, so it is essential that our aspiring youngsters are provided with development opportunities that will compliment the efforts of their clubs and their coaches.

The sponsorship received from McDonald's Family Restaurants is providing management with the opportunity to develop our sport and this season, while a portion has been used to continue providing a uniform for our technical officials, most money received has once again been directed towards our swimmers. Also, Retravision has provided reward cards that the association was able to use to acknowledge the support we receive from our volunteers who assist at the CQ Championships, as well as those coaches who attend.

Sadly for Central Queensland, coaches who have spent many years developing CQ swimmers [who achieve State and National recognition] continue to have southern school based coaches offering parents "sporting scholarships" to entice them to send their children away from Central Queensland and regrettably, many of our swimmers [who could be the role models for our young ones] are being

lost to CQ at a time when they could make such a great contribution to Central Queensland swimming.

Our coaches are doing a great job nurturing and developing the swimmers that we have competing and I suggest that their dedication and skill would not be found wanting should that ever be compared with others. However, I do feel that aspiring coaches may question their reasons for coming to or even remaining in Central Queensland when other coaches are reaping the benefits of their efforts and local councils are not committed to having people manage their pools who can provide all of the services required by their own swimming communities.

On a more positive note, the construction of a FINA Standard – Olympic Pool [now commenced in Rockhampton] may help combat this loss of swimming talent as it will certainly provide CQ swimmers with what, I understand, will be a great facility [the equal any competition pool in Australia] and on its completion, our association will have an ideal opportunity to advance our sport. To this end, discussion has been held with Mr. Tom Upton [Rockhampton Regional Council] for this association to be provided with permanent office space within the developed facility, thereby providing a direct connection between our association, the new aquatic facility and the development of our sport throughout Central Queensland. Additionally, an expression of interest has been tabled with council for this association to be considered for management rights to the facility when the existing management team expires.

With November, 2010 envisaged as the completion date of the FINA Pool, now is an opportune time for our association to explore how it can engage a “Swimming Development Officer” to meet the needs of our sport in Central Queensland.

In review, the 2010/2011 swimming season has been quite difficult for many clubs. Several meets had to be rescheduled and others cancelled because of the extreme weather conditions and flooding experienced throughout CQ. Yet, regardless of the obstacles encountered, our clubs have continued to provide swimmers with support and helping them strive for improved performances.

The contribution made by our technical officials is acknowledged and it is pleasing to note that more clubs have parents embarking on technical pathways that will support the efforts of our children. I encourage all volunteers to gain SQ accreditation for the different technical positions that need to be filled in order to conduct approved competitions.

Wendy Ryan is very deserving of her nomination to receive Life Membership of our Association. She has provided great service to and support for this association before and during my presidency; and she has been tireless in her efforts to teach other volunteers the skills of officiating. We are fortunate to have Wendy as Examiner of Technical Officials in Central Queensland and I thank her for all she has done for our sport. Long after her own children have retired from competition, Wendy's continues to contribute so much to this association's efforts to improve swimming throughout Central Queensland. I endorse her nomination for Life Membership.

At CQ Championships this year, the association used 'online' nominations for the first time. The system did create unexpected difficulties for our meet secretary that increased her work load significantly. Provided that the problems that have been identified have been addressed, I see many benefits in using the online nomination system.

2011 saw the implementation of “The Tri-region challenge” between FNQ, NQ and CQ. Intended to provide an additional competition [for our older swimmers] leading into the Australian Age Championships, the meet was conducted at Proserpine Heated Pool and accommodation sourced at Airlie Beach. Swimmers, coaches, officials and managers interacted well and feedback from all in attendance was very positive. There is preliminary discussion and planning taking place to repeat this team competition next March, also, the possibility of a similar [short course] meet is being considered as a lead in [team] competition to the 2011 Queensland Short Course Championships in August.

Graham Simpson received a Swimming Queensland “Award of Excellence” [for his lifelong involvement in our sport] from Mr John Keppie OAM [President of Swimming Queensland] at this

year's CQ Championship. I am personally thankful for all the assistance he has given to this association's efforts to provide opportunities for our swimmers. Graham is committed to developing our sport in Central Queensland and he does so in a co-operative, unassuming manner. I am certain that those swimmers who have shared Emerging Squad camps with him have benefited from their experiences.

With 50+ swimmers, coaches, officials and support staff converging on Proserpine in late March, it provided the top regional swimmers with an opportunity to qualify for Australian Age Championships or improve their times. We are pleased and proud to say NQ came out the winner. However as this challenge improves we are sure we will have a battle on our hands to stay in front. It is with much appreciation we thank Cannonvale Cannons and Whitsunday clubs for assisting with the pickup and delivery of goods and timekeeping over the 4 sessions.

We presented our clubs with forums on club administration early in the season as many clubs now have new people at the helm with limited knowledge of the necessities required to start each season and or run a meet. Clubs reported these forums to have been an excellent aid.

We were once again successful in obtaining a grant from the 'Gambling Community Benefit Fund' for a second SAT system to enable us to supply the entire region with the use of the system even when 2

meets are on the same weekend. McDonald's Family Restaurants sponsorship was greatly appreciated and assisted our Development program and Regional Championships to be the success they were. We have had a very exciting and full season in Far North Queensland with a number of new initiatives.

Overall our number of competitors increased slightly and with some of the initiatives in place for this year we are hoping to see that trend continue. This season we revamped our calendar to be better aligned with the Swimming Queensland and Swimming Australia calendars. This is intended to give Far North Queensland swimmers a better chance in terms of preparation and racing for both the Short Course and Long Course seasons.

We were able to secure the services of the Swimming Queensland Coach Mentor, Scott Volkers to make regular visits to Far North Queensland, with the specific objective of improving the education and standard of coaching in Far North Queensland. This was seen as an excellent way of Far North Queensland leveraging its spending power and benefiting all swimmers in the region. The response from the coaches and parents has been extremely positive and has resulted in coaches being reinvigorated to the extent of totally reviewing their programs, along with children doing substantial personal bests from the coaches making technical changes to stroke after their time with Scott.

This season saw the establishment of the Tri-Regional Challenge between Far North Queensland, North Queensland and Central Queensland and the inaugural carnival being held in Proserpine. The intention of this carnival is to provide high level competition between the regions to assist swimmers in achieving National times as well as race practise prior to Nationals. It also provides a stepping stone for those swimmers just below National competition to represent their region in a team environment. It is also intended that it will provide swimmers with a wider social network, with the view that it may

encourage the swimmers to stay in the sport to maintain their contact longer. All three regions deemed this a success and it is intended for this to become a regular event on our calendars.

We organised a one day camp for all the Far North Queensland regional relay swimmers in Atherton which was a first and was supported by all the coaches. We hired a bus and all the swimmers travelled together. This was designed to build some team spirit as well as providing the opportunity for the swimmers to get to know each other better and provide a social atmosphere. After the training we had a BBQ at one of the lakes and the swimmers spent the afternoon together. All of this culminated in Far North Queensland winning seven medals in the Regional relays at the State Championships. Our best result in most people's memory.

Our JX clinic was a huge success with Dean Boxall and Chris Wright providing their services and delivering a very informative yet enjoyable clinic with a large member of participants and their parents staying behind at the end of the clinic to speak to both Dean and Chris and have their photos taken with them. Our JX gold development trip to Brisbane for one of the qualifying carnivals was once again successful with the 12 swimmers gaining a great deal of experience in preparation for the State Championships.

Hopefully we will see the benefits of these initiatives continue over the coming years and see it manifested in more swimmers staying in the sport as they get older.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our major sponsors McDonald's along with local sponsors Primo and the Shangri-La Hotel who have all been very supportive of our sport in the region. Lastly I wish to thank my committee very sincerely in conducting our business efficiently and with the minimum of fuss. It has been a pleasure working with you and an honour to hold this position.
