PRESIDENT'S AND CEO'S REPORT

We are pleased to submit to members this report on Swimming Queensland's activities during the 2011/12 financial year.

2012 Olympic Selection Trials

Queensland swimmers and coaches defied even the most optimistic expectations at the 2012 Olympic Trials in Adelaide. The selection of 31 Queensland swimmers and 6 Queensland coaches on the Olympic team set a new milestone for swimming in this State, and well exceeded our previous best Olympic representation – 22 swimmers and 6 coaches in 2008. The feat of accomplishing two-thirds of the Australian team is all the more exceptional when weighed against the fact that Queensland swimmers make up around just one-quarter of the total national membership.

Our contingent of 12 male swimmers and 19 female swimmers looks well placed to put in a strong performance in London, and with many of them aged in their teens and early 20s, to lay a rock-solid foundation for Rio in 2016.

Queensland Coaches on the Australian team are Glenn Baker, Michael Bohl, Matt Brown, Denis Cotterell, Simon Cusack, and Stephan Widmer.

2011 World Championships

At the 2011 World Championships in Shanghai, China, Alicia Coutts and Kylie Palmer both won individual gold medals, while Stephanie Rice claimed a bronze medal. Relay medals were won by Alicia, Bronte Barratt, Kylie and Brenton Rickard. Melissa Gorman and Ky Hurst, who won a silver medal in the 5km team event, earned selection for the London Olympics by finishing in the top 10 in their respective 10km events.

Queensland coaching members on the Australian team were Glenn Baker, Michael Bohl, Matt Brown, Harley Connolly, Denis Cotterell, Simon Cusack, Michael Palfery, and Stephan Widmer.

2011 Para Pan Pacific Championships

Queensland swimmers performed strongly at the 2011 Para Pan Pacific Championships in Edmonton, Canada. In individual events, Kayla Clarke and Blake Cochrane both won four gold medals; Daniel Fox, three gold medals; Brenden Hall, one gold medal, three silver medals, and a bronze medal; and Grant Patterson, two silver medals and two bronze medals.

Steve Hadler, Tony Keogh and Chris Phillips were Queensland coaches on the national team.

2011 World Junior Championships

Bronte Campbell, Bonnie MacDonald and Cameron McEvoy continued their rapid ascent towards the top ranks of international swimmers by winning individual gold medals at the 2011 World Junior Championships in Lima, Peru. Both Bronte and Bonnie won one gold medal, while Cameron claimed two.

2011 Australian Short Course Championships

Multiple gold medals winners at the 2011 Australian Short Course Championships, at which Queensland was the champion State, were Ellen Fullerton, Yolane Kukla, Kylie Palmer, Brenton Rickard, and Christopher Wright.

2011 State Teams Short Course Championships

Queensland maintained its winning streak at the 2011 State Teams Short Course Championships. Queensland swimmers have won the Championships every year since its inception in 2009. As well as claiming the Champion Team trophy, our swimmers won trophies for Champion Female Team, Champion Male Team, Champion Female Team 13/14, Champion Female Team 15/16, and Champion Male Team 16/17. Queensland was once again well led by coach Matt Brown.

2012 Australian Open Championships

At the 2012 Australian Open Championships, 24 of our swimmers won a total of 35 individual gold medals, culminating in Queensland repeating its performance from last year in winning both the Corbett Shield for the women's competition, and the Kieran Shield for the men's. Kayla Clarke won three gold medals. Dual individual gold medallists were: Kylie Palmer, Leiston Pickett, Stephanie Rice, Emily Seebohm, Thomas Fraser-Holmes, Christian Sprenger, Chris Wright, Blake Cochrane, and Daniel Fox.

St Peters Western won the S.B. Grange Trophy for Premier Club.

2012 Australian Age Championships

Queensland's up-and-coming swimmers excelled yet again at the 2012 Australian Age Championships. For the 13th year in a row, Queensland took out the W.B. Phillips trophy as the Premier State. Stand-out performers amongst our emerging stars were Alanna Bowles (five individual gold medals), and Brittany Elmslie and Cameron McEvoy (four individual gold medals each). They were closely followed by Chelsea Gubecka, Shayna Jack, Taylor McKeown, Jordan Harrison, and Regan Leong, all of whom won three individual golds.

Twenty-two of our coaches produced one or more gold medallists at the Championships, evidencing the depth of Queensland's coaching ranks.

2012 Australian Open Water Championships


Ten Queensland swimmers won gold medals at the 2012 Australian Age and Open Water Championships, with Queensland swimmers claiming a total of 28 medals.


2011 Queensland Championships


The 2011 Queensland Championships was the largest for many years. Although the qualifying times in all events were tightened, a total of 1,707 swimmers nominated for individual events, while 1,824 swimmers competed in the relays.

Winners of the major Championship awards were: Cameron McEvoy (Swimmer of the Meet); Remy Fairweather and Amy Forrester (joint winners of Age Group Swimmer of the Meet); Alanna Bowles (Country Swimmer of the Meet); and Brenden Hall (SWD Swimmer of the Meet).

St Peters Western won the President's Trophy as the champion club.







Athlete and Coach Development

The major development activity conducted was a coach education tour to the 2011 World Championships in Shanghai, China. Seventeen Queensland coaches undertook the 12-day trip under the leadership of SQ Mentor Coach, Scott Volkers. Mr Volkers ran the tour as an educational exercise and as if the coaches were leading and/or being a team coach on an international competitive team.

As well as gaining a valuable, direct insight into how international competition unfolds, the trip strengthened the group's resolve to continue advancing their coaching careers and gave them the experience necessary to lead or, at the very least, be a competent inclusion in a team travelling overseas.

This extremely important strategic investment, the benefits of which should endure for decades, underlined SQ's commitment to ensuring that our swimmers will continue to receive the expert coaching required to enable them to succeed at the highest level of competition. It was generously supported by the Queensland Academy of Sport and ascta (QId).

Further extensive coach mentoring was undertaken by Mr Volkers across Queensland, and in some instances included learn-to-swim teachers. Towards the end of the year he accepted an offer to coach in Brazil as the country prepares to host the 2016 Olympic Games. Mr Volkers' contribution to coach development during the relatively short time he worked for SQ was invaluable and greatly appreciated by the participants concerned. He is indeed a masterful coach.

Other development activities included trips to the 2011 New Zealand Short Course Championships under Head Coach, Dion Walmsley (16 swimmers and 4 coaches); to the Great Barrier Reef meet in Mackay under Head Coach, Chris Nesbit (55 swimmers and 10 coaches); and to the NSW Open Water Championships, under Head Coach, Chris Mooney (6 swimmers and one coach); a camp at Southport (34 swimmers and 5 coaches); a camp at the Sunshine Coast (22 swimmers and 5 coaches); and visits to the QAS for the Junior Platinum Squad (54 swimmers and 15 coaches) and swimmers with disability (12 swimmers and 12 coaches).

Financial assistance to access competition was once again provided to regional swimmers, open water swimmers, and swimmers with disability, and to Queensland members of the Australian team for the 2011 World Uni Games.

Coach education and accreditation courses were delivered across the State, with a total of 367 participants.

Technical Official Development

A forum for Judges of Stroke and Inspectors of Turns was attended by 29 Technical Officials from around Queensland.

SQ's highly successful mentoring program was continued. It included sending a Technical Official with the Queensland team to the New Zealand Short Course Championships, as well as six officials to the SAL State Teams Short Course Championships in Canberra, and the mentoring of regional officials at the Queensland Championships.

Members of SQ's Technical Sub-Committee attended each of the Regional Championships to provide feedback to the regions on the officiating at those meets.

Brisbane Swimming Association

Following ongoing difficulties in obtaining Brisbane Swimming Association's (BSA) compliance with its obligations under SQ's constitution, BSA's Management Committee was informed that its application for re-affiliation for 2011/12 would only be accepted upon the Committee signing a declaration that it would fulfil its constitutional obligations.

When this requirement was not fulfilled, the Board was left with no alternative but to inform the Committee that its application for re-affiliation for 2011/12 had been refused. BSA was further informed that if or when it agreed to meet its obligations, the Board would reconsider its application.

Brisbane clubs affiliated with SQ were notified that their membership with SQ would not be affected by the Board's decision and that they would continue to enjoy full access to the services and opportunities normally provided.

The Brisbane Sprint Championships, Metropolitan Junior Championships, Metropolitan Senior Championships, and Brisbane Relay Championships were conducted by SQ.

Membership Development

Participation Fun Day clinics for children with disability were held at Mareeba, Townsville, Rockhampton and Warwick. Financial support from the Queensland Government, Australian Sports Commission and Swimming Australia will enable the delivery of these clinics to be expanded in 2012/13. It will also facilitate the introduction of clinics for indigenous and CALD (Culturally and Linguistically Diverse) children. The inclusion of specific teacher workshops into the clinics will ensure a legacy of swimming education that will provide a profound, enduring benefit to disabled, indigenous and CALD children around Queensland.

Other clinics for disabled children were delivered at Brisbane, Ipswich, Warwick, Toowoomba, Townsville, and Cairns.

Following the success of the Growing Up In Lycra DVD produced by SQ for young female swimmers, their parents and their coaches, work has begun on a DVD about male swimmers. This DVD will feature several elite swimmers, including Kieren Perkins and James Magnussen, and various experts on the development and coaching of the male athlete.

Our suite of popular grass roots programs was continued. They included Macca's Mini Meets (14,000 kits distributed to 80 swim schools); Swim Star (1,000 caps distributed); new member kits (5,500 distributed); Participation and Improvement (15,000 posters and \$5,000 in prizes distributed); fun books (22,000 distributed); participation ribbons (6,500 distributed); and primary school certificates

fun books (22,000 distributed); participation ribbons (6,500 distributed); and primary school certificates (11,000 distributed).

Now that Swimming Australia's new Strategic Plan has been finalised, SQ has begun reviewing its own blueprint for the future. The process will include consultation with stakeholders.

Awards

New inductees into the SQ Hall of Fame were Josh Santacaterina and Brendan Capell, both of whom were 25km Open Water World Champions, and legendary coaches Denis Cotterell and Ken Wood.

Life Membership was conferred on Brian Stehr, Suellen Hardie, Dr Simon Hooton, and Alan Johnston in recognition of their long and meritorious service to swimming in Queensland.

Swimming Queensland Awards of Excellence were presented to David Towner (WB), Diane Daw (GC), Louise Baker (NQ), Ric Whiting (DD), Helen Holmes (Bne), and Sandra Wilks (Bne), while Alan Johnston from North Queensland received the John Keppie Award, for excellence in technical officiating.

Queensland recipients of SAL awards were Blake Cochrane (Multi Class Swimmer of the Year), Melissa Gorman (Open Water Swimmer of the Year), Steve Hadler (Multi Class Coach of the Year), Ken Wood (Open Water Coach of the Year), and Caribeae Swimming Club (Club of the Year).

Susie O'Neill OAM and Kieren Perkins OAM were both inducted into the QSport Hall of Fame.

Acknowledgements

On behalf of the SQ Board, we once again express our deepest gratitude to everyone who leant us a helping hand over the past year. It was yet another remarkable milestone for swimming in Queensland – a year in which a new benchmark was set for Olympic representation by our swimmers and coaches, and one that will perhaps never be surpassed.

Included amongst our helpers were various invaluable sponsors – McDonald's, Speedo, Hancock Prospecting, Swimmeroo, and the Commonwealth Bank. As budgetary pressure on the Queensland Government escalates, signalling likely reductions in the amount of funding it makes available to sport, the support we receive from sponsors is becoming even more important to us.

We also thank SQ's staff, who undertake their multitude of roles energetically and professionally and often go beyond what reasonably could be asked of them in playing their part in ensuring the success of our sport.

TREASURER'S REPORT

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I submit the Treasurer's Annual Report, together with the audited Annual Financial Report for the year ended 30 April 2012.

An operating surplus of \$35,716 was recorded by the Association in the 2011/12 financial year, taking Total Accumulated Funds to \$552,944.

Total revenue for the year was slightly less than for 2010/11 at \$2.008m. The most noteworthy changes from last year were:

- a reduction in Grants income of \$136,000, largely due to a drop in funding from the Queensland Government and from Swimming Australia
- lower Sponsorship revenue and Membership Development expenditure being recorded in the Income and Expenditure Statement due to sponsorship payments from McDonald's for Regional Associations being shown in the Balance Sheet instead
- ٠
- Other Revenue and Other Expenditure reflecting business activity carried out for the Brisbane region as a result of Brisbane Swimming Association not being re-affiliated with SQ.

Approximately one-third of the total amount spent on salaries and wages was recouped from the four organisations for which SQ performs professional and administrative services.

I take this opportunity to thank my fellow Finance Sub-Committee members: John Keppie OAM, Erica Clydsdale, John Dove, and Greg Kukla.

Notes to and forming part of the Financial Statements for the year ended 30th April 2012

Note 1 - Statement of Significant Accounting Policles

The financial statements are a general purpose financial report and have been prepared in accordance with Austratian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the AASB and the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act. The financial statements have also been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non current assets (where applicable) and financial assets and liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

The financial report covers Queensland Swimming Association inc.which is incorporated under the Associations Incorporations Act 1981 and is domiciled in Brisbane Queensland.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements. The acounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Income Tax

No provision has been made for income tax as the Association is exempt under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and current replacement cost. Costs are assigned on a first-in first out basis.

Property, Plant & Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The carrying amount of

property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows, which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amount.

Depreciation

The depreciable amounts of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, are depreciated over their useful lives to the entity commencing from the time that the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements. Depreciation rates are Plant & equipment 7.5% to 75%, leasehold improvements 10% and Historical Gallery 10%.

Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not legal ownership, are transferred to the association are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised, recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual value. Leased assets are amortised over their estimated useful lives. Leases payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense of the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Financial Instruments

Financial instruments are initially measured at cost on trade date, which includes transaction costs, when the related contractual obligation or right exists. Subsequent to initial recognition these instruments are measured dependent on whether they are classified as Financial Assets at fair value through profit and loss, loans and receivables, held to maturity investments, available for sale financial assets or financial liabilities.

Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the liability for employees arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on costs. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the association to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Government Grants

Government grants are recognised at fair value when the entity obtains control of the grant, it is probable that the economic benefits will flow and the grant can be measured reliably.

Notes to and forming part of the Financial Statements for the year ended 30th April 2012

Revenues

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon delivery of the goods to customers. Revenue from rendering a service is recognised upon delivery of the service. Interest income is recognised on an accruals basis.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Impairment of Assets

At each reporting date, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indicator exists, the recoverable amout of the asset, being the higher of the assets fair value less costs to self and value in use is compared to the assets carrying value. Any excess of the assets carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee members evaluate estimates and judgments incorporated into the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the association.

CENTRAL QUEENSLAND SWIMMING ASSOCIATION INC.

As the 2011/2012 season draws to a close, I have great pleasure in presenting my first annual report for the Central Queensland Swimming Association.

I am extremely grateful for the support and tireless work of the rest of the committee and thank them from the bottom of my heart. Collectively the Management committee has focused on the needs of our swimming community in a positive way, and in doing so has made many important decisions in a relatively short period of time.

It is always difficult to hit the ground running when the majority of the committee were new to the role of running an organization as large and diverse as the CQ Swimming Association and I am eternally grateful for the support and input of our continuing members or the committee.

The primary purpose of the CQ Swimming Association must be to promote and develop the sport of swimming in our region, and with this in mind, we worked closely with our coaches subcommittee in finding what was required. As part of this, it was evident that more money was required to deliver the development package needed. The committee made the decision to introduce a \$0.50 levy on nominations to supplement the \$5,000.00 sponsorship from McDonald's Restaurants. This had to be introduced fairly quickly so that enough money was available for the 2012/2013 season. I am pleased to advise that we now have a minimum of \$10,000.00 to support development activities in the coming season.

Due to limited finances, this season's development program was limited to a Starts and Turns clinic in Gladstone for those swimmers attending QLD State Championships and a Combined YPS and JX clinic in Yeppoon in January. Both programs were well received by swimmers and coaches alike. It was a great opportunity for swimmers to hone their skills and develop new friendships. I would like to thank those coaches who freely gave their time for the benefit of our swimmers. Our swimmers will look forward to a full development program this upcoming season which would not be possible without the sponsorship of McDonald's and we thank them for their continued support.

This season I was fortunate enough to be able to visit the Emerald and Blackall meets to talk to clubs about the issues that affect our Central and Far West Clubs. This was a big eye opener for me as to how much our western clubs are hurting and was surprised that I was the first CQSA President to attend the Blackall meet. This was reflected in the fact that even though our numbers were up at CQ Championships, we only had two swimmers attend from these regions. To support our western clubs, the committee has introduced a position of Far West Spokesperson. This position will provide valuable input in the running of the association for all our members.

Another season has flown by and we have been able to successfully build on the momentum from the previous season.

The visits by Swimming Queensland Mentor Coach Scott Volkers that continued on from the previous season on a monthly basis has laid some strong foundations for the coaches that have made the most of the experience and we are seeing some huge improvements from the swimmers under those coaches.

The coaches have been given a taste of the success that this increased knowledge and skills can result in and are looking for more opportunities.

This season's Queensland Short Course Championships saw a record 15 medals won by a small group of swimmers, three of whom made the State Short Course team along with one of our coaches. This gave confirmation to the benefits of the Mentor Coaching program.

As in previous years we bought a team of JX Gold 11 and 12 year old swimmers to Brisbane to compete in the 3rd qualifier carnival in November and once again exposed these swimmers to the Chandler facility, an opportunity to listen to Dean Boxall, Kylie Palmer and others from the QAS squad to gain an insight into what it takes to train and perform at that level and to hopefully light a fire inside some of these young swimmers. One of these swimmers went on to place 4th in the 12/13 year 100m backstroke at the Australian Age Championships this year. Prior to the qualifier carnival she was not even ranked in the top 25.

One of the new programs established this year has been the FNQ High Performance Squad. Swimmers in this region join this squad when they achieve a YPS Bronze standard time or above. The concept is to provide these swimmers the opportunity to train and socialize together to create a more intense training environment along with exposure to peers who have the same issues of time management and schooling to manage with their swimming. These swimmers where exposed to the James Cook University Sports and exercise physiology department for base line testing and the use and benefits of a training diary for both themselves and their coaches. This squad was set certain criteria to meet to be eligible for an end of season trip to the Malaysian Open Swimming Championships held in Kuala Lumpur Malaysia. We took a group of 6 swimmers to the event and returned with 2 gold, 1 Silver and 2 Bronze medals and a swag full of **P.B's. There was a total of 12 countries competing and** provided the swimmers with a great experience, particularly to those who had never travelled overseas before. This was made possible by several generous sponsors, in particular Trinity Auto Group, Marlin Coast Swimming and Fitness and Mr Oscar Cesscotto.

In addition to these sponsors we have also been supported by, McDonald's, Shangri-Ia Hotels, Knight Frank, Primo Smallgoods and several other silent contributors throughout the year to assist the sport in continuing to develop in this area.

The State long course Championships saw the region win a record number of relay medals and several individual medals along with some very large P.B.'s and finals swims. It gives me great pleasure to present the Report on the activities of Swimming Gold Coast for the 2011-2012 season.

Membership

During the season our Region had some 1,563 registered swimmers (competitors and recreational), some 25 registered clubs, 37 coaches, 19 officials, 409 parents, 7 non-swimmers and 11 life members. It is pleasing to note that all categories show an increase in numbers from last season.

Representation

Our Gold Coast swimmers have excelled at local, state, national and international level. Congratulations to Jade Neilsen (Miami); Leiston Picket (Southport); Melanie Schlanger (Southport); Thomas Fraser-Holmes (Miami); Ky Hurst (Bond); Cameron McEvoy (Southport); Brenton Rickard (Southport); James Roberts (Somerset); and Christopher Wright (Southport) on their selection in the Australian team for the forthcoming London Olympics. Congratulations also to the many Gold Coast swimmers selected to represent Australia at World Championships, Pan Pacs, Junior Pan Pacs, Oceania, and World Open Water events.

Region Championships

Our Winter Short Course Championships held in July 2011 was once again very successfully hosted by the Nerang Swim Club with some 394 competitors. Our Gold Coast Championships held in March 2012 was hosted by the Miami Swim Club and attracted some 376 swimmers. Whilst our numbers for our Championships were down on last year's event (due to a clash with State Nipper Championships) the event was very successful with a number of records being broken. Thank you to Nerang and Miami Swim Clubs for hosting those meets.

10,000 Metre World Relay Record

In October 2011 Gold Coast swimmers, clubs and officials got behind one of our own Jordan Hart who was battling cancer, to attempt to break the world 10,000 metre relay record and raise money for the Leukaemia Foundation, Make a Wish and Red Kite. One hundred swimmers rallied to the cause each swimming 100 metres. The record of 1 hour 53 minutes was held by Germany and I am pleased to report

that our Gold Coast swimmers assisted in that record being smashed by some 15 minutes and 30 seconds, thus establishing a new world record.

Workshop

Swimming Gold Coast again conducted a very successful workshop for all clubs hosting meets throughout the season. Attendance at this workshop helps ensure all clubs running a meet during the season have up to date information and qualified people to organise the meet thus ensuring a successful meet. Thank you to our hard working Vice President and Registrar Di Daw for her hard work and dedication for organising and presenting this seminar.

Coaches

Throughout the year our coaches continued with their regular meetings and provided much useful feedback from those meetings back to the Regional Committee. I am pleased to say that many suggestions put forward by our Coaches have been implemented by the Region throughout the season. It is hoped that these meetings between the Coaches and the liaison between them and the Region will continue as it greatly assists the Region in their planning and it ultimately serves its purpose in providing the best opportunities to our swimmers.




