PRESIDENT'S AND CEO'S REPORT

We are pleased to submit to members this report on Swimming Queensland's activities during the 2015/16 financial year

2015 FINA World Championships

The 2015 FINA World Championships in Kazan produced three world champions from Queensland. Emily Seebohm, Bronte Campbell and Mitch Larkin each won dual world titles: Emily in the Women's 100m and 200m Backstroke, Bronte in the Women's 50m and 100m Freestyle, and Mitch in the Men's 100m and 200m Backstroke. Other Queensland medallists in individual events were Cameron McEvoy, Jessica Ashwood, Cate Campbell, and Madison Wilson. Australian relay teams won four medals, with the Women's 4 x 100m Freestyle relay team winning gold. Remarkably, each of these teams comprised Queensland swimmers only.

2015 IPC Swimming World Championships

Brendan Hall built on his stellar international swimming career by winning the Men's S9 100m Backstroke and 400m Freestyle at the 2015 IPC Swimming World Championships in Glasgow. Grant Patterson, Blake Cochrane, Rick Pendleton, and Lakeisha Patterson also won medals in individual events, and Lakeisha was a member of the victorious Women's 4 x 100m Freestyle relay team.

2015 FINA World Junior Swimming Championships

Clyde Lewis and Minna Atherton excelled at the 2015 FINA World Junior Swimming Championships in Singapore. Clyde won the Boys 200m Individual Medley, while Minna claimed the gold medal in the Girls 100m Backstroke, in which she broke the world junior record, and in the 200m Backstroke. Gemma Cooney and Shayna Jack also earned their way onto the presentation dais by winning a bronze medal in individual events. Shayna and Gemma were members of the successful Girls 4 x 200m Freestyle relay team, and were joined by Minna in the gold medal winning Girls 4 x 100m team. New world junior records were set in both events.

2016 Australian Open Championships

Multiple gold medal winners at the 2016 Australian Open Championships were Blake Cochrane, Daniel Fox, Thomas Fraser-Holmes, Mitch Larkin, Cameron McEvoy, David Morgan, Jessica Ashwood, Georgia Bohl, Cate Campbell, Emma McKeon, Lakeisha Patterson, and Emily Seebohm. In taking out the men's and women's divisions of the Championships, Queensland swimmers won 39 events. St Peter's Western was the champion club.

The team selected at the end of the Championships for the 2016 Rio Olympic Games includes 24 Queensland swimmers. The strong Queensland representation means that for the past 11 years we have contributed at least half the national open team for major competitions. Our swimmers will be accompanied by seven Queensland coaches.

Thirteen swimmers and four coaches from Queensland were selected for the Rio Paralympics.

2016 Australian Age Championships

Queensland swimmers won 209 medals at the 2016 Australian Age Championships, 80 of which were gold. This culminated in Queensland winning 55% of the points tally and being awarded the W. B. Phillips Trophy for the 17th year in succession.

Of the 30 individual gold medallists, the most prolific event winners were Elijah Winnington (7), Sarah Beale (4), Laura Taylor (4), Abbey Harkin (4), Gemma Cooney (3), Laticia-Leigh Transom (3), Kaylee McKeown (3), Lydia Murray (3), Sharni Robinson (3), Bailey Coleman (3), Thomas Hauck (3), and Clyde Lewis (3).

St Peter's Western was once again the champion club.

2016 Australian Age Multi Class Championships

The 2016 Australian Age Multi Class Championships also produced another strong Queensland performance, with a total of 17 gold medals being won by five of our swimmers. Multiple event winners were Jack Ireland (6), Keira Stephens (5), and Jake Michel (4).

2016 Australian Open and Age Open Water Championships

At the 2016 Australian Open and Age Open Water Championships at Mooloolaba, Queensland's 17 event winners claimed a total of 20 gold medals, with Jack Brazier, Max Osborn and Chelsea Gubecka scoring two each.

2016 Australian Short Course Championships

Queensland was the top point scoring State at the 2016 Australian Short Course Championships. Its leading performers were Mitch Larkin, Cameron McEvoy, Jessica Ashwood, and Emily Seebohm, each of whom won three events.

2015 Queensland Championships

Major award winners at the 2015 Queensland Championships were Mitch Larkin and Emily Seebohm (McDonald's Swimmer of the Meet joint winners), Minna Atherton (McDonald's Age Group Swimmer of the Meet), Cameron Clark (McDonald's Country Swimmer of the Meet), and Daniel Fox (McDonald's Disability Swimmer of the Meet).

St Peter's Western won the President's Trophy for champion club.

Athlete and Coach Development

The SQ Athlete and Coach Development team was expanded during the year to include two new positions of Coach and Club Development Officer with the goal of achieving sustainable membership growth and improved athletic performance. Barry Prime and Drew McGregor, both of whom have significant experience as swim coaches, were appointed to the positions. Their employment was made possible by Regional Associations, asctaQLD and Swimming Australia co-funding the positions with SQ. Our stakeholders' response to this much-needed initiative has been very positive. With the addition of Barry and Drew, the team is now able to deliver extensive education and support to coaches across the State.

This major initiative was complemented by three talent ID camps at Chandler for swimmers and coaches and a workshop for SWD athletes.

Technical Official Development

This year, SQ implemented a High Performance Technical Official Scholarship Program, modelled on the successful Australian Sports Commission's officials scholarship program, in which former SQ President, John Keppie OAM, had acted as a mentor for several years. Mr Keppie ran the new program for SQ with the following Queensland officials: Rachel Sampson (CQ), Sarah Emery (CQ), Jamie Johnman (DD), Alan Smith (GC), Steve Carsley (Bne), and Peter Turnbull (Bne). All participants reported that they derived a lot of benefit from their involvement.

In addition, a forum was held for Referees, and mentoring of officials was delivered at the Queensland Championships and at the State Teams Championships in Canberra.

Membership Development

Following the successful piloting of the Junior Dolphins Program in Queensland and other States, the program has been approved for a national launch in 2016. The concept has been enthusiastically embraced by all State/Territory Associations and by Swimming Australia, and is now our sport's number one strategy for membership growth. As reported above, SQ has created a new role to help drive development of the sport across the State. Our two new development officers will work closely with coaches and clubs, with a strong emphasis on ensuring that the Junior Dolphins Program meets its objectives.

SQ's wide array of membership programs, such as Macca's Mini Meets, Participation and Improvement Programs, Make A Splash Clinics, and Participation Fun Days, were delivered around Queensland.

Awards

Dr Simon Hooton's wonderful service to swimming over many years as an administrator and Technical Official was recognised through his induction into the SQ Hall of Fame. Dr Hooton also received the John Keppie Award for officiating excellence.

SQ Life Membership was conferred on Warren Grainger (Bne), John Wallace (WB), David White (DD), and Kevin Martin, while Garry Shorter (DD) and Teresa Goddard (Bne) received the SQ Award of Excellence.

Joint winners of the Susie O'Neill Award were Bronte Campbell, Emily Seeböhm and Mitch Larkin. Mitch was also named FINA Male Swimmer of the Year and, with Emily, Swimming Australia's Swimmer of the Year.

Acknowledgements

The support provided to SQ by a vast cross-section of people is highly valued by us as we strive to fulfil our responsibilities as the custodians of our wonderful sport. That support is replicated by our sponsors – McDonald's, Georgina Hope Foundation, Speedo, and Medals Shots – with whom we enjoy mutually beneficial relationships. We are deeply indebted to all of you.

We also express our appreciation to Greg Kukla, who will retire from the Board at the next AGM following six years' service. It was as a result of Mr Kukla's efforts that SQ has been able to forge a highly productive relationship with Mrs Gina Rinehart.

TREASURER'S REPORT

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I submit the Treasurer's Annual Report, together with the audited Annual Financial Report, for the year ended 30 April 2016.

The Association recorded an operating surplus of \$109,690, with Total Revenue growing to \$2.92m. Total accumulated Funds now stand at \$1.16m.

Notable changes from last year were:

- Grants revenue dropped by \$119,000 mainly due to a reduction in funding from the Queensland Government relating to services being provided by Swimming Queensland to the Doomadgee community, and in SAL funding for the Junior Dolphin pilot.
- Athlete and Coach Development revenue grew by \$145,000 principally because of increased Queensland Academy of Sport financial support.
- Shop Sales grew by \$57,000.
- Expenditure on Athlete and Coach Development rose by \$157,000 largely as a result of the employment of Coach and Club Development Officers and inclusion of the Athlete and Coach Development Manager's salary, which is now funded by the QAS.

The financial status of the Association is very healthy, with a strong balance sheet and a healthy level of liquidity.

Assisting me on the Finance Sub-Committee over the past year were Michael Cox, Mark Twyford and Greg Kukla. I express my sincere appreciation to each of them and to SQ's finance team.

Note 1 - Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are a general purpose financial report and have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the AASB and the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act. The financial statements have also been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non current assets (where applicable) and financial assets and liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

The financial report covers Queensland Swimming Association Inc. which is incorporated under the Associations Incorporations Act 1981 and is domiciled in Brisbane Queensland.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Income Tax

No provision has been made for income tax as the Association is exempt under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and current replacement cost. Costs are assigned on a first-in first out basis.

Property, Plant & Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amount.

Depreciation

The depreciable amounts of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, are depreciated over their useful lives to the entity commencing from the time that the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements. Depreciation rates are plant & equipment 7.5% to 75%, leasehold improvements 10% and Historical Gallery 10%.

Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not legal ownership, are transferred to the Association are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised, recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual value. Leased assets are amortised over their estimated useful lives. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense of the period.

Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Financial Instruments

Financial instruments are initially measured at cost on trade date, which includes transaction costs, when the related contractual obligation or right exists. Subsequent to initial recognition these instruments are measured dependent on whether they are classified as Financial Assets at fair value through profit and loss, loans and receivables, held to maturity investments, available for sale financial assets or financial liabilities.

Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the liability for employees arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the Association to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Government Grants

Government grants are recognised at fair value when the entity obtains control of the grant, it is probable that the economic benefits will flow and the grant can be measured reliably.

Revenues

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon delivery of the goods to customers. Revenue from rendering a service is recognised upon delivery of the service. Interest income is recognised on an accruals basis.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Impairment of Assets

At each reporting date, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indicator exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the assets fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the assets carrying value. Any excess of the assets carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee members evaluate estimates and judgments incorporated into the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Association.



REGIONAL REPORTS

BRISBANE SWIMMING ASSOCIATION INC

On behalf of the Management Committee of Brisbane Swimming, I am pleased to present the 2015/16 Annual Report. This has been another successful season for the region, its swimmers, coaches, officials and clubs.

The region's membership currently stands at 84 clubs with 9,312 members. The regional championships (Short Course, Junior and Senior Metropolitans, Sprints and Open Water) attracted more than 15,800 nominations. The A-Grade meets, conducted by 24 clubs, saw over 30,000 nominations, while the Development meets, conducted by 14 clubs, saw almost 8,000 nominations. There are now 1657 Junior Dolphin members in Brisbane, enjoying free membership and an introduction to the sport of swimming.

51 selected Brisbane swimmers enthusiastically represented the region at the annual Patrons' Shield meet, this season hosted by Wide Bay Region. Once again, Brisbane retained the Shield. At Queensland State Championships, Brisbane continued to field 2 teams in the Regional Relays. Swimmers from Brisbane clubs featured prominently in the Queensland team that won the State Teams Age Short Course Championships at the Australian Institute of Sport, Canberra.

Internationally, the 2015/16 season saw the FINA World Championships in Kazan, Russia, IPC World Championships in Glasgow, Universiade in Gwangju, FINA World Junior Swimming Championships in Singapore, Commonwealth Youth Games in Samoa and the BHP Billiton Aquatic Super Series in Perth. Swimmers, coaches and support staff from the Brisbane Region performed with distinction at all these events, demonstrating the excellence and true sportsmanship we have come to expect. At the 2016 Brisbane Sprint Championships, Minna Atherton twice broke the World Junior Record in the 50m Backstroke, while Rowan Crothers broke the IPC World Record for 50m Freestyle S9 at the Brisbane Short Course Championships.

Our Brisbane Development Day in October was an inspiring event, thanks in large part to the planning efforts of Regional Development Coaches, Barry Prime and Drew McGregor. The day featured guest speakers Madi Wilson, Bronte Barrett, Brenden Hall, Chelsea Gubecka, Tommaso D'Orsogna and Acacia Wildin-Snedden. Activities included a JX forum followed by swim session for almost 100 swimmers; a YPS swim session for almost 100 swimmers; a coaches' workshop attended by around 30 coaches; and a parent workshop. Also for parents, we held our inaugural Parent Forum during the Junior Metropolitan Championships. Stephan Widmer, SQ Mentor Coach, delivered a fun and fact filled presentation on being the parent of a swimmer. Brisbane Swimming intends to offer a parent forum during all our Championship meets, covering a range of topics of interest to swimming parents.

The Brisbane Open Water Development Squad was provided with 2 Open Water training clinics under the guidance of Trent Grimsey, World-Record holding Open Water swimmer. In addition, they received entry to the Mooloolaba Mile Ocean Swim to hone their skills. 10 Macca's Clinics were conducted for 7 to 12 year-olds by 10 clubs between February and April 2016. The young swimmers were treated to talks by high-profile swimmers Meagen Nay, Kylie Palmer, Jade Edmistone and Ellen Fullerton.

Brisbane is well represented by Technical Officials at state and national competitions. Congratulations to Teresa Goddard who was appointed by FINA as an official for the Kazan World Championships - the pinnacle for technical officials. As a region, we are always looking for new people to swell the technical official ranks at our Brisbane Swimming meets.

The 2014/15 annual Awards Presentation function recognised last season's top performers. Teresa Goddard was named Technical Official of the Year. Margaret Squires received the Hazel Ferguson Award for Volunteer of the Year. Gemma Cooney received the Glen Bigg President's Trophy as Swimmer of the Year and Minna Atherton was awarded the Brisbane Rising Star Award. Brisbane Swimming acknowledges the ongoing support of our sponsor Vorgee, whose representatives Leigh Dempsey and Quinton McCoy are regularly in attendance at our meets, as well as at our awards function. The continuing sponsorship from McDonald's is also much appreciated and provides significant financial support to the association.

During this season, Brisbane Swimming lost well-loved coach and long-time supporter, Mary Wood. Mary was a strong advocate for high quality coaching at the earliest age. She once said, "You have to teach every child to swim as if they are going to be an Olympian. Because if they're 80 years old and they're in a wheelchair, you can chuck them in a pool and they can still swim like an Olympian but you can't run a marathon when you're 80." What a splendid philosophy! Vale Mary.

Many thanks to all the technical officials, volunteers, club administrators, coaches, parents and of course the swimmers who, in combination, contribute so much to the success of Brisbane Swimming. We are also indebted to Swimming Queensland for its role in our administration. Particular thanks to my fellow members of the current Management Committee for the time and effort they put into the running of this association. Thank you all.

This year in the Management Committee introduced a series of Development Grants so that clubs may undertake development programs that may ordinarily be beyond their reach. A sum of ~\$18,000 has been allocated to date which roughly represents 2 years of development levy contributions from carnivals. Next year will see a shift in focus from club based activities to SQ Activities and those providing Clusters of Clubs Clinics.

Our State & National swimmers this year again showed CQ can match it with the best medalling in a range of events; these young men & women should be proud of their achievements. Coaches & parents also deserve praise, as their support is integral to the swimmers success.

Sadly this year we lost a great friend in Mr Nev Hamilton. Up until last year, Nev hadn't missed a CQSA AGM since its inception. We have included the commemoration prepared for his funeral service.

The 16/17 season will get a kick start with the Olympic Games which will hopefully feed the sport through higher participation; we just have to work at it staying that way.

It is with pleasure that I present the annual report on the activities held in this region for the 2015-16 season. It has been a busy season with new initiatives been introduced. The members of the Management Committee have been working with members of various Subcommittees and a whole range of technical, professional and voluntary providers to implement the programs for the 2015-16 season. We are now planning for the upcoming season to continue to take the region forward.

Development

This season the DDRSA joined with Swimming Queensland (SQ) to take part with funding to access Barry Prime the SQ Development Coach. This was a major investment by the DDRSA in development, with the goal presented by SQ being the development of clubs and coaches throughout the region at the grass roots level. The progress of this investment in development is evolving with the fine tuning of Barry Prime's role.

The last weekend of October is traditionally set aside for the DDRSA development weekend each year. The weekend commenced with a JX clinic at Fairholme on the 31st October and a clinic for older swimmers on the 1 November at Toowoomba Grammar. This year the coaches workshop held on the development weekend was hosted by Barry Prime to provide support and networking opportunities for our DDRSA coaches. The Sunday following the Country Championships is traditionally set aside for a development clinic. This year Goondiwindi was the venue for the clinic on Sunday, 17th January.

2015 JX Clinic Toowoomba

The 2015 JX clinic was as always again very successful with coaches assisting Barry Prime to facilitate an extremely beneficial swimming clinic and a skills session facilitated by SQ Athletic Development Coordinator Scott Munro. This year Chelsea Gillette (Queensland Swimmer) was the invited guest swimmer. Chelsea talked to the swimmers in the morning and then hopped in the pool to demonstrate the skills she uses in training to be the best swimmer she can be. Also in the morning session we had two local swimmers Jacob Whale & Grace Saxton who talked with our junior swimmers on swimming on the downs. Jacob and Grace are a credit to their clubs, region and their parents.

2015 YPS Clinic Toowoomba

The Sunday clinic was held at Toowoomba Grammar for our older JX/YPS swimmers. Again it was received well by those who attended. Barry Prime then conducted a water session with assistance from the coaches that attended.

2015 Coaches Workshop

2016 Development Clinic held at Goondiwindi

After a cold and wet but successful Country Championships held on the 16th January, Goondiwindi was the venue for a development clinic on Sunday, 17th January. This clinic was open to all swimmers in our region and saw 82 swimmers take part. This year the session was led by SQ Development Coach Barry Prime who facilitated the clinic along with coach's Jade Edmestone Encore, Garry Shorter, Michael Wise and Gail Smail, each coach doing skills and activities with the swimmers. 82 swimmers attended the 3 hour session. The swimmers found it very worthwhile.

The DDRSA acknowledges the ongoing support received over many years from Gail Smail, Garry Shorter, Michael Wise, for without their time and expertise freely given, the DDRSA could not hold our annual Development Clinic activities. 


