PRESIDENT'S & CEO'S REPORT

We are pleased to submit to members this report on Swimming Queensland's activities during the 2017/18 financial year.

2017 FINA World Championships

At the 2017 FINA World Championships in Budapest, Queensland swimmers won a total of four medals in individual events, with the best performance being recorded by Emily Seebohm, who won the Women's 200m Backstroke, a repeat of her accomplishment at the 2015 World Championships. Emma McKeon was the other Queensland medallist, with two second placings. Queensland swimmers also featured strongly in the relays, in which Australia won two silver and two bronze medals.

Erin Collis was appointed as a Starter for the Championships.

2018 Commonwealth Games

Queensland swimmers comprised 59% of the Australian swimming team at the 2018 Gold Coast Commonwealth Games (67% of able-bodied swimmers and 38% of para swimmers) and amassed the lion's share of Australia's medal haul in the pool.

In the individual events, our swimmers claimed 68% of Australia's medals. Queensland's able-bodied competitors won 13 of Australia's 15 gold medals, and three-quarters of its relay gold medals, while their para team mates claimed 57% of Australia's para medals.

Our most successful swimmer was Mitch Larkin, who won four individual events. Cate Campbell, Lakeisha Patterson and Ariarne Titmus all won two gold medals in individual events, while Shayna Jack, Bronte Campbell, Emma McKeon, and Cate combined to break the world record in winning the Women's 4 x 100m Freestyle Relay. Lakeisha set a new world record in the Women's \$8 100m Freestyle.

Ten of the team coaches were Queenslanders, and Erin Collis had the honour of being appointed a Starter at the Games.

2017 FINA World Junior Championships

Both Zac Stubblety-Cook and Elijah Winnington won bronze medals in individual events at the 2017 World Swimming Championships in Indianapolis.

2018 Australian Age Championships

Our youth swimmers continued Queensland's proud record of success by winning 64 individual events and a total of 183 medals at the 2018 Australian Age Championships. Queensland's 34 gold medallists were prepared by 24 coaches.

Stand-out performers for Queensland were Michaela Ryan, with six gold medals; Jenna Forrester, the winner of five events; and Thomas Hauck, Lani Pallister, and Elijah Winnington, each of whom won four gold medals. They were strongly supported by triple gold medallists, Samuel Short and Kai Thomas, and by dual event winners, Connor Brackin, Elizabeth Dekkers, Madeline Gough, Flynn McGregor, Thomas Neill, Mollie O'Callaghan, Georgia Powell, and Laura Taylor.

2018 Australian Age Multi Class Championships

At the 2018 Australian Age Multi Class Championships, Katja Dedekind, Jack Ireland and Madeleine McTernan excelled by each claiming four gold medals.

2018 Australian Open and Age Open Water Championships

Queensland swimmers won 13 gold medals at the 2018 Australian Open and Age Open Water Championships. Both Hayden Cotter and Chelsea Gubecka won two events.

2017 Australian Short Course Championships

Queensland was the leading State at the 2017 Australian Short Course Championships. Emily Seebohm underlined her longevity in the high performance ranks of our sport by winning four gold medals, which were matched by David Morgan. Cate Campbell and Grant Patterson claimed three events each.

2017 State Teams Championship

The Queensland team prevailed again at the 2017 State Teams Championship. As well as winning Champion Team trophy, Queensland was named Champion Male Team, Champion Female Team, Champion Male Team 14/15 years, and Champion Female Team 13/14 years.

2017 Queensland Championships

Major award winners at the 2017 Queensland Championships were Ariarne Titmus (McDonald's Swimmer of the Meet); Thomas Hauck (McDonald's Age Group Swimmer of the Meet); Lakeisha Patterson (McDonald's SWD Swimmer of the Meet); and Ty Hartwell (McDonald's Country Swimmer of the Meet).

St Peter's Western won the President's Trophy and Hancock Prospecting Trophy for Champion Club.

Athlete and Coach Development

SQ's ability to deliver coach and club development services has been greatly enhanced over the past few years. Its team now comprises a Coach Development Director, a Coach Development Officer, two Coach and Club Development Officers, a Sport Scientist, an Athletic Development Officer, and a Para Development Officer.

Major activities included Paulus Wildeboer Scholarships for emerging coaches to attend the 2017 FINA World Championships and 2018 Commonwealth Games to observe international swimming competition first hand and learn from the experience under the guidance of the SQ team. The scholarships enabled six Queenslanders to make the journey to Budapest, and another 16 coaches to the Gold Coast Games.

Nine of our swimmers and four of our coaches participated in the Japan Open, while two swimmers and a coach attended an Open Water Swimming World Cup. Fifteen coaches attended a workshop delivered by international sport science expert, Jan Olbrecht. Two talent ID camps and a stroke camp were held in Brisbane and on the Gold Coast, while nine inter-regional clinics were held at local level, catering for 324 swimmers, 52 coaches and 237 parents. A camp for SWD members attracted 22 swimmers and seven coaches. One-on-one mentoring, education and support was provided to coaches across the State.

Technical Official Development

The annual Referees Forum was attended by 34 Technical Officials, and 18 officials participated in an Assessor and Mentor Workshop. Mentoring of Technical Officials was conducted at both the State Teams Championships and the Queensland Championships.

Membership Development

Clinics conducted by SQ for children with special needs, indigenous children, and children from culturally and linguistically diverse communities totalled 85, with 7,926 children participating. Workshops for teachers

and clinics for school and learn to swim teachers attracted 824 attendees. 85 swim schools conducted Macca's Mini Meets.

Awards

New inductees into the SQ Hall of Fame were Alicia Coutts OAM, Jodie Henry OAM, and Christian Sprenger.

SQ Life Membership was conferred on Erin Collis (NQ), Theresa Manning (NQ), Diane Daw (GC), David Gregory (Bne), and Gail Smail (DD). Recipients of the SQ Award of Excellence were Sarah Emery (CQ), Garry Gibson (DD), Tim Hiller (NQ), Trevor Williams (NQ), and Edelene Koplick (Bne).

Emily Seebohm OAM was named the Susie O'Neill Swimmer of the Year and Olympic Program Swimmer of the Year. Her coach, David Lush, received the Olympic Program Coach of the Year award. The Paralympic Program Swimmer of the Year and Paralympic Program Coach of the Year awards went to Rowan Crothers and his coach, Rob Van Der Zant.

QSport award winners were Kaylee McKeown (Queensland Junior Sport Star of the Year) and Erin Collis (Queensland Sport Officiator of the Year). Jess Schipper OAM was inducted in the Queensland Sport Hall of Fame.

Suellen Hardie received the John Keppie Award for officiating excellence.

TREASURER'S REPORT

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I submit the Treasurer's Annual Report, together with the audited Annual Financial Report, for the year ended 30 April 2018.

The Association recorded an operating surplus of \$49,435, with Total Revenue of \$3.105m. Total Accumulated Funds grew to \$1.317m.

Notable changes from last year were:


- Shop income dropped by \$113,000 due to heightened competition in the swim suit market.
- Grants income grew by \$136,000 largely as a result of increased funding from Swimming Australia for club and coach development and from government entities for indigenous programs.
- Membership receipts were \$49,000 lower because of Swimming Australia's reimbursement in 2016/17 of foregone membership income relating to earlier periods.
- Athlete and Coach Development expenditure was \$75,000 lower mainly because a Queensland team was not sent to a World Cup pool event this year.
- Employee Benefits outlays rose by \$80,000 principally because of added investment in SQ's staffing capacity.

The Association remains in a solid financial position, with a strong balance sheet and a healthy level of liquidity.

Assisting me on the Finance Sub-Committee over the past year were Michael Cox, Mark Twyford, Kevin Martin, and Erin Collis. I express my sincere appreciation to each of them, and to SQ's finance team.

Note 1 - Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are a general purpose financial report and have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the AASB and the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act. The financial statements have also been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non current assets (where applicable) and financial assets and liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

The financial report covers Queensland Swimming Association Inc. which is incorporated under the Associations Incorporations Act 1981 and is domiciled in Brisbane Queensland.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

Income Tax

No provision has been made for income tax as the Association is exempt under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and current replacement cost. Costs are assigned on a first-in first out basis.

Property, Plant & Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amount.

Depreciation

The depreciable amounts of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised leased assets, but excluding freehold land, are depreciated over their useful lives to the entity commencing from the time that the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements. Depreciation rates are plant & equipment 7.5% to 75%, leasehold improvements 10% and Historical Gallery 10%.

Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not legal ownership, are transferred to the Association are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised, recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual value. Leased assets are amortised over their estimated useful lives. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense of the period. Lease payments under operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Financial Instruments

Financial instruments are initially measured at cost on trade date, which includes transaction costs, when the related contractual obligation or right exists. Subsequent to initial recognition these instruments are measured dependent on whether they are classified as Financial Assets at fair value through profit and loss, loans and receivables, held to maturity investments, available for sale financial assets or financial liabilities.

Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the liability for employees arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the Association to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Government Grants

Government grants are recognised at fair value when the entity obtains control of the grant, it is probable that the economic benefits will flow and the grant can be measured reliably.

Revenues

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon delivery of the goods to customers. Revenue from rendering a service is recognised upon delivery of the service. Interest income is recognised on an accruals basis.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Impairment of Assets

At each reporting date, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indicator exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the assets fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the assets carrying value. Any excess of the assets carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee members evaluate estimates and judgments incorporated into the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Association.

On behalf of the Management Committee of Brisbane Swimming, I present the 2017-18 Annual Report to Swimming Queensland. This has been another successful season for the region, its swimmers, coaches, officials and clubs.

Brisbane swimmers represented Australia at International events, including the World Championships in Budapest, the World Junior Championships in Indianapolis, the Summer Universiade in Taipei and the Youth Commonwealth Games in Nassau. The only female Australian medallists in Budapest were Emily Seebohm (Brisbane Grammar) with back-to-back Gold in 200m Backstroke and Bronze in the 100m Back and Emma McKeon (then of St Peters Western) with Silver in both the 100m Fly and 200m Free.

At the XXI Commonwealth Games on the Gold Coast, Brisbane swimmers collected 15 individual Gold medals: Mitch Larkin (SPW) 4; Ariarne Titmus (SPW) 2; Cate Campbell (Chandler) 2; Lakeisha Patterson (Lawnton) 2; Emily Seebohm (Brisbane Grammar), Clyde Lewis (SPW), Brenden Hall (Lawnton), Jack McLoughlin (Chandler) and Bronte Campbell (Chandler) 1 each. Games Records were set by Cate Campbell, Ariarne Titmus, Emily Seebohm, Bronte Campbell and Mitch Larkin, with Cate and Ariarne each breaking an Oceania record. And who can forget the World Record in the Women's 4x100m Freestyle Relay with Cate and Bronte Campbell and Shayna Jack (Chandler) in the team. Topped off by their medals being presented by Susie O'Neill.

Brisbane swimmers also competed as Queensland team members. Liam Hunter and Mikayla Messer (Chandler) and Abbey Harkin (St Peters Western) competed at the 2017 Japan Open. The 2017 State Teams Championships in Canberra included 22 from Brisbane clubs out of the 40 team members, along with 4 coaches.

Brisbane played host to the 2017 Patron's Shield, winning for the 5th consecutive year. Our team consisted of 26 boys, 22 girls, 5 coaches and 2 managers. At Queensland State Championships, Brisbane continued to field 2 teams in the Regional Relays.

The region's total membership currently stands at 83 clubs with 10,303 members. Exciting to break through the 10,000 barrier. It is pleasing to see the regular applications for affiliation from new or re-establishing clubs in our region. Our regional championships (Short Course, Open Water, Sprints, Junior and Senior Metropolitans) this season attracted almost 17,000 nominations. The Preparation meets had over 36,500 nominations, an increase of around 10,000, with Development and Transition level meets seeing a decrease to just over 7,000 nominations. It is important for clubs to recognise the value of holding these more introductory levels of meets, bringing the experience of competitive regional swimming to our newest members in a less intimidating atmosphere.

Brisbane region has again increased its investment in Development Activities, this season committing

over \$66,000 to this vital area. 38 swimmers participated in an Athlete Potential Workshop, an interactive workshop run in conjunction with leading sport psychologist, Georgia Ridler from SportPsych Qld. Exploring topics such as confidence, focus, perseverance and mental toughness, both in sport and in life, the participants were mentored by World Champions Emily Seebohm and Mitch Larkin. 63 swimmers attended a series of 3 Stroke Training Sessions, conducted by Olympic Coaches Barry Prime, Brant Best and Rick Van Der Zant. 32 swimmers, 9 coaches and 2 managers attended this season's Big Brisbane Camp, a annual feature on our development calendar. 21 swimmers benefitted from the 2 Open Water clinics, conducted by Trent Grimsey's Grimsey Adult Swim Fit, participation in which included eligibility to compete in the Noosa Summer Swim. Around 160 youngsters enjoyed the 2 Macca's Clinics hosted by the Sunnybank and East Brisbane Swim Clubs. Around 120 swimmers took part in 5 Aquatic Body Alignment Clinics with former Breaststroke World Record Holder, Jade Edmistone.

Our development activities are not only for athletes but for their parents as well. At our annual Parents' Forum during the Metropolitan Junior Championships, interested parents were addressed by SQ Athletic Development Coordinator, Grant Jenkins. He spoke on the topic "Beyond Resilience", dealing with matters such as helping young athletes deal with success and cope with failure.

Becoming an official is an excellent way to show support for your athletes and may open up a whole new area of interest that can endure long after you are no longer required to drive them to training and competition. Swimming Australia has a complete pathway of training modules for technical officials, from Timekeeper through to National Referee. It has been my pleasure to deliver this initial accreditation training to interested members of several clubs over the season.

The 2016/17 Annual Awards Function recognised last season's top performers. Warren Grainger was named Technical Official of the Year. Margaret Pugh and Pat McGinley shared the Hazel Ferguson Award for Volunteer of the Year. Ariarne Titmus from St Peters Western was awarded the Brisbane Rising Star Award and Jack Cartwright, also from St Peters Western, received the Glen Bigg President's Trophy. Brisbane Swimming acknowledges the continuing support of our sponsors, McDonald's and Vorgee. Their representatives are always kept busy at the Awards Function, presenting trophies and awards. Two new Life Members were announced at the 2017 AGM, Teresa Goddard and Robert Van Der Zant.

A new award this season is the Club of the Year Award. This encourages clubs to examine their efforts in the areas of recruitment of members and technical officials; creation of a positive club environment; effective management practices; and inclusion of their local community. The inaugural trophy was presented at the 2018 Awards Function to the Acacia Bayside club.
